HHØN

The Radio Club of Haiti is operating from Navassa this week, signing HHØN, as predicted in TDXB #98. The operation will not count for DXCC unless the Club provides the DXCC Desk with copies of permission from the U.S. Coast Guard, plus with proof that they are/were operating from Navassa itself and not some other spot close. QSL manager for the operation is WD4JNS, Julio Ripoli, 1286 S. Alhambra Cir, # 1M4, Coral Gables FL 33134.

AFRICA

Vince Thompson, K5VT, appeared last week from the Congo, signing TNØVT; he advises that he expects to be in Burundi 9U5, Lesotho 7P, Zimbabwe ZE, Kenya 5Z, and Tanzania 5H, all with operating permission likely. Other stops which may or may not allow air time include S9, 5V, 5U and TT. QSLs to K5VT, whose last known address was 4028 Perlita, Apt. 4, Los Angeles CA 90039.

ARRL/DXCC

All 60ØDX Somalia QSLs are now good for DXCC, beginning with July 20, 1980 (ref. TDXB #90). QSL manager I2YAE (PO Box 15, Ispra Varese 21027, Italy) had suspended all QSLing until the matter was laid to rest. Those who have been awaiting cards should expect them to appear in the near future.

W4MGN is on schedule with his African operations, having just been at the

9U5JM station in Burundi. Ed will be bringing back paperwork which may clear up the documentation situation (no 9U5JM cards are presently accepted for DXCC). 9U5WR continues active, and QSLs for that station (by SP6FER) are acceptable.

JA8BMK has reportedly been at XZ5A again, to deliver a linear amplifier and antenna parts. ARRL has sent letters to the central government in Rangoon, via the U.S. Department of State, and any DXCC credits will have to wait until a reply is received.

The latest ARRL Director's Letter reports on disposition of the K6LPL situation. The Director's Letter states that K6LPL had submitted phony cards for his personal DXCC early in 1981, on two occasions. The League decided to treat correspondence from K6LPL in the order in which it was received. Thus, although Dave resigned from the DXCC program in May, the League has now officially disqualified him from DXCC on the basis of the DXCC endorsement submissions which came before the resignation. These actions have no effect on K6LPL's recent DXpeditions and the resulting QSLs, nor does the disqualification have any bearing on the distribution of phony blank cards by K6LPL and others.

If you missed W4MAT/SV5 and SVØAA/5 last week, DJØUN/SV5 will give another opportunity for Rhodes Aug 1-8 on 40-10 Meters. This will be a CW only operation stressing 15 and 20 Meters. QSL DJØUN.

Nothing was heard of the Dutch group aiming for Monaco last week, although their advance publicity had been extensive.

A San Felix CE0X operation continues to be top news from most sources; Bob Reed, SV0BV, and others are aiming for the middle two weeks of September. They are apparently collecting money in an "escrow fund" c/o N4CNL.

ZL1AMO, following his recent Lord Howe VK4ANS/LH operation, now plans to activate Kermadec in November or December of this year, but needs \$3000 to pull it off.

A good multiplier in the CQ World-wide DX Phone Contest the end of October will be ZK2 Niue, by members of the No. California DX Club, who have licensing permission at hand. They will not be assigned callsigns until arrival on Niue. Other members of the Club will be on Niue at the end of November for the CW part of the Contest.

It is well known that California has both a Northern and Southern DX Club; unfortunately, many there have been burdened by living midway between the two clubs' centers. On Aug 2, a fairly large group of DXers will meet in Visalia, at the Holiday Inn, at 2 pm. You can get a chicken dinner and discuss the possibility of forming a Central California DX Club. Earl Warford, W6MEL, is spearheading the effort to form a new organization for those who find it difficult to participate in the activities of the two other DX clubs.

Although the Sovereign Military Order of Malta (1A0KM) has not yet been approved for DXCC status, it is a foregone conclusion that it will be before long; I0MGM advises that he plans another operation from SMOM in September. QSLing for past operations is current, with all cards received having been answered.

One of the many U.S. citizens stationed on Diego Garcia is C.E. Coursey, N3QA. He signs VQ9QA, will be on until September as follows: 14030 at 1000-1400Z; 21050 at 1600-1800Z. Days of the week vary but usually include Sat and Sun.

A4XIJ has been found in the 15 Meter Novice band (21100-200) around 0000Z; he is just learning the Code so go easy.

TDXB STICKER BANK

For those new to TDXB, the DXCC Transparent Sticker Bank was established last summer to maintain a storehouse of the soon-to-be extinct transparent DXCC endorsement stickers. The transparent stickers are being phased out by Newington and are being replaced with opaque white jobs. If you have spare transparent stickers please contribute them to the Bank. In return, the bank endeavors to supply you with transparent stickers (in case you are sent opaque ones and don't want them on your certificate). Present needs of the Bank are for 270, 315, 325 in particular.

FCC on June 4 issued an Order to Show Cause and Suspension Order in the matter of deliberate interference to the Maritime Mobile Net (14313) by K4MME and W1GM. FCC's document is significant because the importance of various nets to the public interest is stressed. They specifically mention nets used by military personnel, medical nets (Eye Bank), nets used by missionaries from the States, and nets formed during natural disasters. There is no mention of DX nets. The FCC order also states that both W1GM and K4MME are (were) Extra Class licensees, and FCC points out that the Amateur Extra Class license carries the greatest mode and frequency privileges of *any license which they issue*, amateur or otherwise.

The Central Pennsylvania DX Club will operate WB3DNA/Portable TMI from the site of the former Three Mile Island nuclear power plant 80-10 Meters Aug 22 and 23.

A small, dedicated group continues trying to work all Russian oblasts (TDXB 96) and they have a very esoteric newsletter being distributed by K1KI. If you are searching for new horizons drop K1KI a SASE or two for a sample. Looks like K3EST leads the pack, needing only three Oblasts to have them all.
