SAN FELIX

Bob Read, WB1GDQ, got his new Extra class callsign just in time, and left Connecticut for Chile with it in hand Oct 14, Wednesday. He hopes to be on the air from San Felix by the weekend of Oct 17.

Both WØAX and N4CNL have bowed out of the operation; Read will be joined in Chile by two locals for the helicopter trip to San Felix. It is believed that these two Chileans are very newly licensed as hams. Read will have to take care of business matters on the island before any hamming is undertaken, and the length of his stay will be at the discretion of the island's commanding officer.

Read will be using a KWM-380 on loan from Collins, and other unspecified equipment. As time on San Felix will be very limited, it is hoped that those not needing a contact will wait patiently for those who do, and requests for changes in band and/or mode will probably not be accommodated. Read is expected to do quite a lot of CW operating, though.

He will be announcing the QSL route instructions on the air once operating has begun. All plans for a short stop on Juan Fernandez have been cancelled. As WA4WME has said, "There are only 14 real DXpedition spots; all the rest are vacations." San Felix is NO vacation.

SMOM 1AØKM

ARRL's DX Advisory Committee has recommended and the League's Headquarters Awards Committee has approved DXCC country status for the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, but the matter does not yet appear to be settled. Internal dissension both on the DXAC and on the HAC has surfaced, as well as considerable grumbling from many DXers.

It is said that material in hand in Newington had been lacking one vital piece of documentation concerning SMOM...this particular item was hand-carried back by ARRL Communications Manager Lindholm, W1XX, who visited SMOM while on a trip to Italy. Sources report that this item swayed the HAC to accept the DXAC recommendation, which had been on a close vote. The vote within the HAC itself was four-to-three, with DXCC manager W3AZD not voting (as is customary). Word is that had W3AZD voted, the score would have been four-four, and country status would have not been granted.

DXCC status for SMOM first became a topic of discussion in the early 1960's; ARRL general manager John Huntoon, in a letter to a prominent DXer, stated in 1967 that so long as SMOM had "no telecommunications activity and thus no assignment of a prefix by ITU, (they would) find it difficult if not impossible to consider it a new country."

Nothing at SMOM has changed in the intervening fourteen years, but ARRL management and decision-making has. Therein lies the reason for the change of attitude.

BURMA

JA1BRK, Tac Yonemura, has circulated a letter to a number of groups and publications (including TDXB). Actually, it is a translation of an article written for one of the Japanese amateur radio magazines. After the initial XZ9A and XZ5A operations were organized by JA8BMK and JA8BKM, Tac decided to visit Karen State himself for a look-see.

Tac's article makes several salient points, one of which is that although the licenses for XZ5A and XZ9A were not issued by the Rangoon government, apparently the operations have met with no resistance from the central authorities. He points out that Burma, since its independence from England following WW 2, has been a fragmented country, with several nearly autonomous regions having different cultures and languages. The Karen people, in particular, have been subject to periodic persecution by Rangoon.

Thailand, which borders the Karen state, has unofficially recognized it for many years, and is presently supplying both food and arms of war to the Karen people. Apparently, Thailand, which is surrounded on all sides by "non-free" countries, believes the Karen state to be an ally.

JA1BRK (and others) believes that for these and other reasons, XZ5A and XZ9A operating from Kaw Thoo Lei, Karen State, should be granted separate DXCC status independent of Burma, under DXCC Countries List Criteria #1 (Government).administration).

Many will compare this situation to that of Southern Sudan, granted country status in 1973. Southern Sudan, actually three provinces in the south of Sudan, was granted "limited autonomy" by the central government in 1972, in response to sporadic rebellion by the provinces against the central government, rebellion which had a twenty-year history.

Questions which must be answered are 1) does "limited autonomy" equal "separate government?" and 2) how limited is the autonomy of the Karen state?

Last weekend's New England DXCC Banquet hosted about eighty DXers for an afternoon and evening two-session gathering. Featured speakers Dave Fisk, KA1CY (D4CBC operation early 1980), Don Search (ARRL DXCC manager) and Vince Thompson, K5VT, were all well-received. Dr. Thompson's presentation centered around his professional work, which is to train doctors in surgery in Third World countries. WIDA's DX quiz, a toughie, was won by K1MM, K1ST, and K5VT.

CONTEST EXPEDITIONS

More expeditions reporting in for the CQ WW Phone Contest...

Three well-known contesters will slug it out from the Caribbean: Dick Norton, N6AA, will again operate 9Y4VU, trying to regain his single-operator all-band world record, which was taken by EA8AK last year.

Jim Rafferty, N6RJ, heads for Grand Cayman and will sign either ZF2RJ or his host's call, ZF1MA. His time will be limited but Jim says he may get in a little CW work the last day or so before the Contest.

Bill Ovca, N1GL, will activate the Dominican Republic, with either an HI8 call or N1GL/HI8. He particularly mentioned operating 160 Meters both nights at 0600Z on 1818.

Bill Zachman, W6TPH, begins a four-country trip as W6TPH/CT3 on Madeira Is. for the CQ Phone Contest. He then will be trying for stops at the Comoros D68, Mayotte, FH0, before ending on Rodriguez 3B9 for the CW CW Contest just after Thanksgiving. Just in case on-site facilities aren't adequate, he's taking a vertical for 40/80/160.

Dave Gardner, K6LPL, will operate VO2CW (a good zone multiplier) in the "Phone Contest, single band 20 Meters.

 usable for overseas mail.

TDXB UNOFFICIAL RULES FOR LIST OPERATIONS

1. The list "manager" will always be on time for the list
2. The DX station will never be on time for the list running
3. The manager will always start on the opposite end of the
 order from your call (if you're a "1" he'll start at Ø)
4. If there are five stations in your call area and you are the
 weakest, they will list only four of you
5. You will always be at least three S units louder at the DX
 station than you are at the list manager's station
6. You will always be at least three S units louder at the DX
 station than the list manager is
7. The three people ahead of you will request (and get) two-way
 SSTV contacts and the band will go dead
8. You will be in the Sandbox when your call is called
9. The DX station will not show and the list will be carried
 over to the evening of your wedding anniversary
10. If you ask for QSL information they will put you on a list for it
11. The ability of the list manager will be inversely proportional
 to his class of FCC license
12. Once you make DXCC Honor Roll, every country you need will be
 available only on lists
13. Your medical insurance will not cover toes broken from kicking
 your operating desk.
