SAN FELIX

What began as a planned five-operator, three rig, seven day expedition to San Felix ended as a one-man, three day, surreptitious activity on Oct 15, 16, and 17. KF10 sandwiched 700 contacts into his commercial work schedule before being asked to leave two days ahead of schedule.

Bob Read, KF10, was on San Felix doing electronic survey work on behalf of the Chilean government for his American company. He carried with him top secret security clearance papers and authorization for amateur radio, but the Island's commandant was not impressed and amateur radio was very low key.

Read will file a written report on his findings and recommendations; sometime in the future another visit may be made to San Felix to do the required work to the island's communications systems.

It is common knowledge among such groups as Amnesty International that not only does San Felix have military fortification, but also it "houses" a number of political refugees from Chile's recent past. It is virtually off limits to all Chileans.

Two possible sources of the pressure

which resulted in Read's being asked to leave the island early have been mentioned: the first is that some Chilean hams were unhappy at an outsider being able to obtain operating permission for San Felix when the Chileans cannot, and, second, that a Chilean official had promised an American ham friend operating permission first for San Felix. Actually, the amateur radio license for CEØX is easy... getting permission to visit the island is what is so tough.
