SOME THOUGHTS ON THE CQ WORLDWIDE DX PHONE CONTEST

Note: this is a highly personal report...facts are facts but the opinions expressed are solely those of the editor.

Friday afternoon of the contest...what to do? Single band seriously without a monoband beam? Naw, forget it. Ditto all band serious effort, with no antennas up for 80 and 160 yet. Work a hundred countries each on 10, 15, and 20? Too much work for nothing. Guess we'll just scout the bands and work multipliers.

What's this? Trap vertical not working on 40 and 80! Blown trap. Rats. Get out aluminum stock, build 33-foot stick. Put it up and it works, naturally. There goes 80 completely. Top fifteen feet of vertical is quarter-inch aluminum, hope we don't get any wind.

Contest starts...10 and 15 both open to Japan, 20 to Europe, etc. Europeans S9 on new vertical. Tuning around to see who's on. Here's P41C...must be Curacao again, multi transmitter. Wonder why they picked a call which would require precious time to explain? Wouldn't an ordinary PJ2 call have been more productive? Funny, too, that a special contest callsign can be issued but foreigners aren't allowed to have PJ9 calls any more, not even those who own homes on Curacao. Very odd.

Try 20...there's VO2CW operated by Dave Gardner, K6LPL. Should be a shoo-in for top single band 14 MHz award. Wonder if Dave will beat the USA entries by be-

ing able to operate below 14200? Should be a tremendous advantage for him, not to mention the great demand for Zone 2. He's very loud.

Jim Rafferty's on too, signing ZF2FL; N6RJ should be competitive for awards, although world-high all-band will be almost impossible for him from a "2-point area." Next day, never hear Jim anywhere but 20 Meters, so guess he's single band there. Will he beat Gardner? We'll have to wait a full year for the results in CQ mag.

Might as well try some split freq. work on 40...wow, this Collins sure is nifty for that. Everyone seems to be much more efficient at getting on the DX station's listening frequency these days. Guess that's the advantage of the new radios with digital readout and fast vfo switching. Very few people transmitting out of band accidentally, too.

Here's VP2KAE on 40, one call. He is being slowed up by stations only signing their suffix rather than whole call. A contester's nightmare having to make two transmissions to get the call, half at a time. Wonder if those guys are up to their old tricks? Sure enough, there's VP2KAA on 20 Meters, single band operation. Probably in the same room there on St Kitts.

One call to VK, ZL, and half dozen to get KX6ZY. Funny call. VK4VU running about three a minute on 40. What an op!

PJ8UQ on all bands from St. Maarten as scheduled, and Stan, WIKX, is on

the other side of the island signing FG7AR/FS7. Thanks, Stan, for the multiplier.

Hours into the contest finally 10-cate Dick Norton, N6AA, at 9Y4VT. He's on 40 working a few multipliers, I wait for him to listen above 7150, and he never does. Strange, thought he was out after his record (again). Never hear him again the entire weekend.

Still looking for IAØKM, too. SMOM was rumored scheduled for this weekend, but they don't show. Nothing from FOØFB, either, nor JX8A. HZIAB is on but not a full-bore operation, and they are about 20 dB weaker than HZIHZ. Too bad.

Isn't it curious how some proposed operations make massive efforts at advance publicity and never show, while others never say a word and then just appear?

15 Meters...now here's a pile-up!
5Z4CA doesn't know how to handle it,
either. What a mess. Now he's going
back to big station N5__, again he calls
him, and a third time! N5__ is too busy
shouting to hear 5Z4CA. A hundred
witnesses can't be wrong!

ZK1CG, VQ9AB, and K4YT at 9U5WR are all "going by call-area." And, of course, the first maxim of that kind of operation is that when you tune onto the channel the DX just passed your call-area. This kind of operating is OK for casual days but frustrates contesters no end.

DAIWA/LX is on 15 as promised but never heard on another band...ditto J6LIR operated, we suspect, by WB6FCR. OHØBH is on but in ten hours we can't find him (them).

Hey, here's another VP2K...this time KAC on 15 Meters. That makes three of 'em. Iris is at 8P6QL with cross-island competition by 8P6MH. No N6CW signing VP2VDH, either, but VP2VFL is on and must be Terry.

With N6RJ/ZF2FL and N6AA/9Y4VT seemingly out of the all-band picture, our thoughts turn to who might win the world. Bill Ovca shows from the Dominican Re-

public at HI8PGG and going like gangbusters. We find him quickly on all bands. No one seems likely to be competitive, except perhaps last year's winner EA8AK, who we hear only on 10 Meters. Wouldn't it be something to have a world record set from a "2-point" country?

Maybe N6KT/HKØ can do it from San Andres? He's pretty loud on all bands and seems to be working W stations well, but we don't hear him working much else. This is a DX contest and multipliers are critical.

Speaking of multipliers, K6HNZ/CT3 is found on 10, 15, and 20...they probably made contacts on the lower bands, too.

Seems they are concentrating on W6 stations. Big signal. We never hear the Northern Cal DX Foundation station, ZK2ZZ, but understand they were on with a raspy signal. Maybe rig problems.

The big multi-single out of Europe sounds like Tina's YU3EY station. The 15 Meter operator there turns out to be Ron Delcourt, F5QQ, of FYØBHI/FY7AK fame of a few years ago. Ron is back in Eu briefly after an 18-month solo ocean jaunt in a 32-foot boat. He taught English on French Guiana in the mid-70's, and he was the first non-native English speaker we ever had visit who caught virtually all the nuances of "Saturday Night Live."

KP4BZ and crew pull off their multisingle operation from Montserrat VP2MFW... another 2-point area but good accomodations.

CR9D by OH5VD and XZ9A come back to CQs on 20 Meters, but not worked on the East Coast on the higher bands. Can you count XZ9A as a multiplier (as it does not count for DXCC)? Well, experienced contesters will put it in the log and count it, but the CQ Contest Committee will undoubtedly delete it.

By the way, could you have counted 1AØKM as a country multiplier (if it had been on)? That's sticky, as DXCC credit begins January 1, 1982, for past contacts. We leave that decision to CQ, just in case 1AØKM made a brief appearance.

No contest would be complete without working Fred Laun, K3ZO, and sure enough he

Big pile low end of 20 for VK somethingor-other, and both WIRM and N4RM are there calling. This is always good and we stop to listen. "QRZ the Radio Mexico," and you know the result. N4RM works him and says, laughing, "there's WIRM on calling you, too." To which the VK replies "Roger, give WIRM our regards. QRZ?"

You don't think others are up on American politics? You should hear the guffaws that Kl Tricky Nixon gets.

More good stuff...Jim Bullington is on at least two bands as TYAll, working the pileup pretty well. 7Q7LW appears, too, mostly answering CQs. There are at least two HBØ operations, TL8RC is on 15, 4U36UN is a special call from UN Hq, and some lucky ones have UK1PGO Franz Josef Land answer their 15 Meter CQs.

Sunday morning and someone is trying to run a phone patch to Trinidad on 14250! A clear frequency would be appreciated, but a miracle would be more likely. Even W3BL has moved up above 14250 for the day. Says he can't find any of his DX friends on 14205.

Two multi-multi US stations are battling for Bottom Spot on 20, too. One is on 14200.3 and the other on 14200.8. We can't hear a trace of either below '200. The battle of the titans seems to have been taken again by Jim Lawson's W2PV crew. And it's always nice to see the crown won from a station put together by smarts and hard work instead of with Daddy's money!

Want to work your DXCC in a weekend? In this contest you don't even have to switch bands to do it...WING, with four elements at 55 feet works 133 countries, 27 zones, on 15 Meters single band, but he gets beat by W9ZRX, with fewer mults but more contacts. JAs, of course. WING admits he did miss a few multipliers that were on the band, too!

As for your editor, not a Big Gun on any band, ten hours of operating produced 70 zones and 187 DXCC country multipliers. But we listened a lot more than we talked. The power line leak, by the way, is better for some reason but still not fixed. If the people in houses near that power pole knew, we'd get results!
