In addition to the 20 and 10 Meter times and frequencies for BV2A/B on page 3 of Issue 116, W7PHO now advises that Tim has received permission to use 15 Meters beginning December 1, 1981. His assigned frequencies will be 21030/21100 CW and 21270/21350 SSB. He will be active on 15 the same days as on the other bands, i.e., Wednesdays and Saturdays.

## F.E. HANDY, W1BDI

Ed Handy, W1BDI, passed away November 11, 1981. Ed worked at ARRL Headquarters from 1925 until 1967, and served in various volunteer roles after that time. Ed was Communications Manager of the League for most of his forty five years at the headquarters. He authored the very first edition of the League's famous Radio Amateur's Handbook...the first one was called "Handy's Handy Handbook."

Only those who have worked at the Headquarters for some length of time know just what an accomplishment spending forty five years on the staff is. W1BDI was responsible for much of amateur radio operating procedures as we know them today.

Also as reported here several months ago, George Moore, W9VL, is now active from Botswana, signing A22GM. He wanted A22VL but the letter "V" does not exist in the local language (Tatswana). George says licensing in Botswana is a snap and took him about five minutes (that's even faster than VP9!). His friend Larry Smith, N4FD, will be visiting during March for the ARRL International DX Competition, and they hope to have some sort of special call for the Competition. QSLs for A22GM go to N4FD, also.

CR9AN's big signal out of Macao comes from nothing more than a dipole hung out a window, but Phil Weaver, VS6CT, is sending him a triband beam which was left in Hong Kong last spring by KP2A of the International DX Foundation.

VK9NL, Kirsti, wife of Jim Smith, VK9NS, said the other day that chances for a Heard Island operation this year or early next are now put at about 50-50. There is indeed another scientific group boating there around the first of January but space appears to be the biggest problem.

European sources say that the attempt for an Albanian operation the first week of December by several Spanish hams looks more and more likely. One of the Spaniards has family in Albania, a prime requisite for admission.

## K4YT IN AFRICA

## SAN FELIX

Karl Renz is on schedule in Africa, getting on the radio when his government communications duties permit. In Burundi, Karl operated briefly from 9U5WR (a Pole), whose station is a TS-830S and some marginal wire antennas. George is "afraid" to put up a beam antenna. Karl also visited 9U5s CA and JM.

In Rwanda, Karl tried for his own call sign but was turned down. As his stay was very short there anyway, he made a stop at 9X5NH and got on the air only on 15 and 20 Meters. 9X5PP was home in England at the time, and 9X5SP was on holiday in Germany.

In Kenya, Karl reactivated his own call plus did some operating from 5Z4GM. He left Nov 4 for Malawi and 7Q7LW, then to Zambia until the 12th, Tanzania Nov 18-24.

Karl is due in much-needed Malagasy Rep Nov 24-Dec 2, but chances of operating do not seem good...5R8AL was reported not wanting any guest operators, with no explanation of how JA2KLT/5R8 got to operate from there a couple of months ago.

K4YT plans on being on Mauritius Dec 2-13 (permission almost guaranteed) and then the Seychelles Dec 13-20, where he will meet his brother Bob, W2TK.

And finally, Karl arranged a meeting with Somali's Minister of PTT, to whom amateur radio was explained. The Minister stated that their Somalian laws were "changed" following the most recent revolution there, and amateur radio was prohibited. When asked about operations by 6OØDX and T5TI, the Minister asserted they were "never licensed by the PTT." QSLs from both these stations are accepted for DXCC in Newington.

## SOUTH YEMEM

Although talk continues of an operation from the People's Democratic Republic of Yemen (70) indications are that chances are absolutely nil. Here is the complete text of a letter to an amateur in Scandinavia, in reply to his inquires about operating from either/or S. Yemen and the Kamaran Islands...

"Yemen Telecommunications Corporation  
October 31, 1981":

"Amateur Radio Station: we are very pleased to inform you that we have received your letter regarding above subject. At present we are very regret to inform you that Amateur Radio Station(s) in our country is still under study, and not yet established. Please accept our Regards."

Unless something changes, ARRL DXCC will be accepting KF10/CEØX QSLs for credit, when the cards begin circulating. KF10 has left copies of his documentation for the operation in Newington, as well as a copy of the log to prevent any phonies coming in the door. Below is the text of a letter from the Radio Club of Chile, sent to ARRL headquarters on Nov 4:

"During October 15, 16, and 17 last, a radio station signing as KF10/CEØX was heard on various amateur frequencies working several hundred stations specially from North America.

"The station gave its position as San Felix Is, and the name of the operator as Bob. As up to our knowledge, no amateur radio station had been authorized to operate from that location, in spite of several requests, we were extremely surprised by this 'DXpedition.'

"Most of the operation was recorded on tape by one of our members and relayed along with other information both to the Naval authorities, actually in charge of the island, and to the Chilean Telecommunications Bureau in charge of amateur radio licenses.

"We are including for your information two copies of letters sent to us by the Chilean Estado Mayor de defensa Nacional and the Subsecretaria de Telecommunications, which are self explanatory (in Spanish-ed).

"Nevertheless we would like to point out that after all the investigation we have done on this matter, the following conclusions are definitive:

- "1. Mr. Robert Read has never set foot on San Felix Is.
- "2. The only license Mr. Read received from the Chilean authorities was issued to WB1GDQ/CE3. This license only enabled Mr. Read, as WB1GDQ and not as KF10, to operate from continental Chile. At present this license has been cancelled.
- "3. Mr. Read has never obtained a contract from the Chilean Naval authorities, in order to perform electronic survey work on San Felix Is.
- "4. The operation must have taken place with a portable rig, somewhere in between the Valparaiso and Santiago areas, in such a location it is almost impossible for U.S. hams, specially those situated in the western part of the country, to detect if a signal is coming out of the island or from continental Chile.

"We ignore the reasons why Mr. Read set up this incredible insane hoax. The information published in Issue 113 of The DX Bulletin, probably given by KF10, is so childish and at the same time so infamous, to say the least, (contd)

that it does not resist any serious analysis whatsoever.

"There is with no doubt an obscure intention in all this matter, and we think that most people that heard Mr. Read's operation are well aware of this situation. We do not remember in recent years, another operation that has raised so much anger and controversies on the air, and such obscene language and jamming on Mr. Read's transmitting frequency.

"It is quite obvious that all these hams knew or suspected that the whole set up was a fake, and were extremely upset by his procedures.

"We think amateur radio as a whole has gone one step back and DXers around the world have received a serious blow. We feel it is about time that severe disciplinary action should be taken against people as Mr. Read, who lack the minimum of respect to foreign countries and fellow amateur radio operators."

The editor of TDXB has seen copies of a license for KP10/CE, as well as copies of various documents signed and stamped by the commandant on San Felix Island. These are the same documents on which ARRL is basing its approval of the operation for DXCC credit.

The last operation from San Felix was in 1972, by two Americans. Previous operations were in the 1960's. There is no indication of when, if ever, an operation from CEØX took place by Chilean amateurs. Given the information available to us, TDXB stands by its original report of the operation as published in Issue 113.

Recent operations by "TJ1BF" saying QSL to K4MME are a pirate; the TJ1BF licensee is presently home in Israel.

Tom Gallagher, N6RA, will work the CQ WW CW Contest as FCØFOO, from a lighthouse on the southern tip of Corsica. All-band, single-op, including 160 Meters.

ARRL does not accept ADØS/KH5 Palmyra QSLs because documents indicating permission to be on the island have not been provided.
