PROPAGATION FORECAST: Nov. 10, Above Normal; Nov. 11, High/Above Normal; Nov. 12, High Normal; Nov. 13, 14, 15, Above Normal; Nov. 16, High/Above Normal; Nov. 17, High Normal; Nov. 18, High/Low Normal. Tnx N4XX.

PUBLISHER'S NOTE: Last week's issue, dated October 31, should have been labeled Issue 11, not Issue 10. This week's issue of The DN Bulletin is abbreviated because we are printing it ourselves, for the first time. It seemed prudent to allow some slack time for things like not knowing how to run the press.

WARC REPORT: Week of Oct. 29-Nov. 3. "Most of the WARC activity this week, insofar as amateur radio is concerned, was in the H.F. Present allocations have strong support and relatively little opposition. There was some discussion of the proposed new bands at 10, 18 and 24 MHz, and they received strong support by such countries as New Zealand, Norway, Australia, Yugoslavia, Jordan, Syria and the USA. Most opposition to additional amateur spectrum comes from countries who wish no reduction of their fixed service allocations. The week of Nov. 5-10 has six full days, plus several night sessions, as the conference struggles to meet the scheduled Nov. 30 conclusion."

874 NEUTRAL ZONE: All indications are that this operation will GO starting Nov. 10. JYI is apparently involved along with at least one well-known European DXer. The bands are rampant with rumors about this one and we just pass them along.

ARRL INTERNATIONAL DX COMPETITION FORMAT IS CHANGED FOR 1980, despite internal Headquarters staff opposition and a mixed Contest Advisory Committee vote. The changes, finalized last week, will make the ARRL DX Competition virtually a carbon copy of the CQ Worldwide Contest, except that the point system will offer some incentive for non-US/VE to work US/VE. Fifty plaques will be awarded, for which sponsors are solicited (\$40-\$50 each).

The primary CAC objection was not to the changes themselves but to the rapid implementation of them. Two Headquarters staff members of the ARRL Awards Committee and one alternate member have resigned from the Committee; their objections were to the format changes themselves. ARRL General Manager Baldwin and Assistant General Manager Sumner (an Awards Committee member) are both at the WARC in Geneva, Switzerland.

Complete details will appear in January QST. Competition dates are unchanged (third weekend of Feb. and first weekend of Mar.).

May all of you consider CDXA when, in the near distant future, we will again be in a situation to put together another DXpedition to some far away place."


No Bandpass this issue; most received was one-time Contest contacts anyway; expanded Bandpass next issue.




