POLAND

Several months ago amateur radio operators in Poland were required to register lists of their radio equipment with local authorities, and were also probably given instructions as to where to turn in their equipment to if that order was given.

When the military took over on Sunday, December 13, included in the orders was a dictate regarding communications with the outside world. Those who worked the ARRL 10-Meter Contest that weekend had no doubt what was happening...many SP stations were heard the first day of the activity but only one or two appeared on Sunday.

CBS and NBC News both contacted the ARRL headquarters early in the week of Dec 14, hoping WIAW would be able to call "CQ Poland" and establish some contact. The League referred the news organizations to a local Connecticut amateur, one known to be knowledgeable in these matters. He declined the opportunity. On Wednesday, Dec 16, the CBS Evening News broadcast featured two West Coast amateurs who had been in contact with SP stations following the leave-the-air order.

All amateurs are advised that they may indeed run into clandestine stations operating out of Poland. If an SP callsign is heard it is advisable to NOT repeat that callsign if contact is established. Any work by Polish amateurs is likely to be on CW, transmissions brief. Hams should try to copy the transmissions as accurately as possible. Reports of such contacts made to TDXB will be forwarded to the proper authorities.

There are over 6,000 Polish amateurs and it is highly unlikely that all of them turned in all of their equipment.

Rumors of an International DX Foundation sponsored Navassa expedition, publicized last week in both *QRZ DX* and the *Long Island DX Bulletin* are absolutely NOT true, according to IDXF. They are still recovering from the costs of last June's Desecheo operation and IDXF at this time has nothing in the works except their usual QSL services for a number of DX stations.

TN8AJ is on 28750 at 1200Z almost every day (strong) and YI1AS is on 28760 at 1400Z some days (weak). When DK2OC and his buddy G4CHP cannot hear YI1AS they call the schedule off, even if US stations can copy the YI.

PAØGMM, Guido van den Berg, is off on another Pacific tour shortly. All his stops with appropriate dates are listed in the Calendar, including KX6, YJ8, C21, T2, T3Ø, and T32. He'll be using an FT101ZD and 12AVQ on SSB only, 14200, 21300, and 28600. QSL with appropriate additions to his home address.

DL1VU is said to have left Germany 7 December to begin his Pacific operations. His first stop was in 9M2 West Malaysia (no operating contemplated). No timetable for the operations is available because his transport will be by boat, but the stops include 9M2, VK, ZL, VK9N, FK0VU, YJ0VU, 3D2VU, FW0VU, 5W1DC, ZM7VU, DL1VU/KH8, ZK1XG, ZK1XG/North, ZK2VU, A35VU, then ZL, VK, 9M2, and DL. A pretty ambitious itinerary. Look for him from the first interesting stop, Norfolk, before the New Year.

9Y4KG by Iris and Lloyd Colvin concluded Dec 2, tallying 9,000 two-ways with 141 DXCC countries, about equally divided SSB and CW. They were active in the CQ WW CW Contest at the end of November. They advise that Trinidad features "complicated, time-consuming, and costly" customs procedures for radio gear. It took them eight days to get their radios released from customs. Next operation for them will be W6QL/8R1, Guyana.

Jeff Maass, K8ND, is looking for two more operators to join a group for the 1982 ARRL International DX Competition, CW, in February. All arrangements (including transportation) have been made and there is little for the prospective team member to do but contact Jeff and cough up some dollars. A new computer-generated custom DX listing is being offered by Jon Presley, WD0EAO (Rte 3, Box 117, Lebanon, MO 65536), featuring prefix, country name, CQ Continent, CQ zone, ITU zone, both long and short path bearings and mileages, and spaces to check off "worked" and "confirmed." One thing missing which would be nice is spaces to check off the country on five or six different bands. Cost is \$6.95 plus \$1.50 for postage.

Mick Koelble: "I'd like to say a few words about list operations. I have worked a few stations on list type operations but I gave it up about a year ago. After working them I lost the feeling of accomplishment and I felt I had not actually worked the station. After all, what did I do but sit for an hour and wait for someone to give the DX station my call and tell him to listen very carefully while I gave him a report and he gave me mine. Where was the fun and sport?"

"To discourage list operations you might stop publishing any information about them in TDXB." (Mickey is N8BKB).

As Ackroyd and Belushi said in the Blues Brothers, "We're on a mission from God." However, we do not think that someone who actively opposes list operations yet works new countries via lists (if that is the only way) is a hypocrite.

Asking DXers if they work lists is sort of like asking people in North Carolina if they vote for Jesse Helms. Few will admit it but many do.

Fred Matos: "After reading your reviews of the CQ WW Con-

tests I wonder if I was in the same contests. On the CW Contest report, how much of the rare DX was located via the 2-Meter net? I run a single-op modest station also. Some of the DX you listed I never heard, even though I was on much longer than you were. I never heard an SU or 9K2."

Fred, I worked 364 contacts in 302 countries on CW, including 25 on 80, 36 on 40, 82 on 20, 80 on 15, and 79 on 10 Meters. That's running a KW, TH6DXX, and dipoles. I'd guess I got about twenty of the countries via the Net, and I contributed a lot more, primarily because I was spending all my time listening. One trick I use is to listen to a multi-transmitter station work a rare one, and when they move him to another band, follow them and pick up the multiplier again.

Although I already have 5-Band DXCC, I have kept track since Oct 1, 1981, and I have in ten weeks worked a hundred on 40-10 and 70 on 80 Meters. It can be done (5-Band DXCC) in three months.
