In two weeks you will be able to phone <u>TDXB</u> toll-free! Just as soon as Ma Bell installs my "800" number I will be publishing the number for you to use. It will be good for all states except Alaska and Hawaii (sorry, Lee).

The information published here (and in other sheets) about a Caribbean operation by Jerry Prestel, KA9BSD, was a hoax. Jerry had nothing to do with it. Whoever did it has also been bootlegging the call ZF2FR and will probably also be faking 6Y5YY and V2ASD. Do us all a favor and don't work any of those calls.

Carl and Martha Henson, WB4ZNH and WN4FVU, are off on a four-week vacation starting January 7. Their first stop is scheduled to be Equatorial Guinea, and although they have no advance licensing their hopes are high. In addition, the Hensons have last-minute word of the possibility of an operation from a fairly rare spot, not necessarily in Africa. We will post you on any last-minute happenings next week.

That "ZD9BU/MM" does not count for anything. However, ZD7BW is now saying that ZD7HH will leave for Tristan da Cunha on February 10 or 11. This one has been talked about for so long that it is just liable to actually happen.

It is now being reported that YIIAS will not be on the air again for several months. Keep checking DK2OC, 28740/1230Z.

Two different scientific expeditions to Heard are now being discussed...one by Americans and one by Australians. No mention of any real radio operators being included, so if any shortwave activity takes place it may resemble the aborted try of two years ago. Jan/Feb is the window for Heard visitations.

FB8WG Crozet reported by one correspondent last week, on 20 CW. No word from W7PHO or others on when the 20 Meter SSB schedules might be resumed. These were going about six weeks ago on 14225 between 1200 and 1600Z.

 $\underline{\text{TDXB}}$ is sitting on about 150 requests for $\overline{\text{QSLs}}$ from KF10/CEØX. We will answer them when and if logs for the operation ever show up. Nothing has been heard from KF10 for several months now.

The Associated Press reported on Dec 30 that three people are stranded on Palmyra Island; the Coast Guard has refused to aid them because "it does not have vessels that can go down there." AP says that Palmyra has one resident, Ray Landrum, who is a caretaker for the owner. Landrum has been maintaining shortwave radio contact with the shipwrecked Canadians' relatives.

Gary Huff: "It grows quite boring to K9AUB have you (TDXB) mix your pre-

judices (about lists and nets) throughout the pages with never an opposing viewpoint being allowed. I demand equal time.

"What is all bad about a list and net? Is it because a third party enters between an exchange? If so, you must surely also condemn 2 Meter repeaters. Oscar satellites must also be brought to task. (Why not condemn) pile-up DX operators who let the calling go on for many minutes, or the ones who 'listen 14200 to 14300'?

"Where is the sin of a net keeping a frequency clear so a fellow running an Argonaut can exchange reports with a DX station? Do you feel that the fellow running an Argonaut is to be denied the working of DX? Or how about a certain D68 who speaks no English and uses a list to help him overcome the language barrier? And what about the busy DX station who has only an hour or so a week to operate, and uses a list to sort out the pileup beforehand so he can work as many stations as possible?

"Or could it just boil down to the fact that you have invested thousands of dollars on a Kilowatt and a 6-element beam at 100 feet (70 feet-Ed) and it just kills you to hear some poor slob with 100 watts and a dipole get to work a DX station ahead of you? Should we pass a rule that ham radio should be relegated to "rule of the jungle" and only the most powerful stations with the most gigantic antennas be allowed to work DX?

The fact is, my friend, that you are simply prejudiced against lists and nets, and yours is not the sole opinion on the subject. There are no laws about how DX is to be worked, and if you prefer to work it one way, why are you so against another fellow enjoying his hobby his way on a net? Your method of DXing (pileup breaking) inspires its own breed of corruption in the form of super-power or that particularly foul

practice known as 'call loudest, call longest and call last.' Why don't you just devote yourself to reporting the DX in an unprejudiced, unbiased manner, and leave out the editorial material, which I really don't care to read anyway. I am paying for DX news, not your personal opinions."

The editor You gosh-dang liberals! As replies: both my friends know, I per-

sonally am very conservative, and I suppose it slops over into TDXB. Honestly,
Gery, I am weary of dealing with lists and
nets in these pages, but the fact is that
they are the most devisive thing that has
happened to DXing and ham radio in some

Many of us feel that any third-party assisted contact does not constitute a legitimate contact for awards purposes. Your comparisons to repeaters and Oscar satellites are ridiculous. It should be noted that repeater and Oscar QSOs do not count in contests. And the fact that some lids take up 100 KHz with their pileups and others are slow in pileup situations no more justifies lists than, say, the fact that many people are too lazy and/or too stupid to fasten their car seatbelts justifies mandatory airbags.

You bet it would gripe me to have to wait in line behind a bunch of Argonauts and dipoles to work one of the sixteen DXCC countries I still need. Nobody gave me my license, nobody gave me a dime to build a station with, and no Elmer held my hand while I learned how to operate.

Mostly, amateur radio is pretty boring; what's fun about talking to a perfect stranger with whom you probably have nothing in common except a radio license? I do it for the sport, and I do contests and DX chasing exclusively. When you take the sport out of DXing you have destroyed it. International goodwill? Nonsense. What does saying "5-9, please QSL" do for goodwill?

Now let's drop it.
