As you undoubtedly know, Carl and Martha Henson came on from Annobon Island last week, Carl (WB4ZNH) signing 3CØBC and Martha, WN4FVU, using the call 3CØAC. They first appeared Saturday, Jan 23, and operated through late Thursday, Jan 28. They will be home in the Atlanta area Sunday Jan 30, and we expect to have a full trip report shortly. QSL 3CØAC to N4NX and 3CØBC to K4PHE.

Ron Szama, LU2A (ex-LU2AFH) is now on from South Shetlands signing LU5ZI; says he will be there about one month, which would make the operation run through about the middle of February. His next stop is as yet undecided... ask him when you work him.

DLIVU has finally shown on the first leg of his Pacific operations, signing YJ8VU. He likes low-band CW. Next stop was tentatively scheduled to be the Fiji Islands, then Wallis. See Issue 121, page 2.

XEIJ is now saying for sure that the "Mexico DX Club," of which he is a long-time member, will operate from Revilla Gigedo Feb 12-15, "on all bands." It is possible they might sign AF4J, which is a call which has been used on past operations.

KF10/CEØX QSL cards are expected to go into the mails around mid-February; ARRL has yet to make a decision on the acceptibility of the operation for DXCC credit. Read will be back in the States (from Greece) in early February. He's talking about a possible joint venture with Jim Smith, P29JS, to Heard Island. No word from Smith on this.

If you worked IØONU on 160 Meters in the CQ Worldwide 160 'Test last weekend, it was probably for real, and was the first 1.8 MHz operating from Italy ever. IØJX says special permission was granted for IØONU (UNICEF station) to use the band that weekend only. QSL to IØJX.

"1AØKM" on 80 Meters in late November and early December was a pirate, according to station operations manager Mario Gallavotti, IØMGM. He says the only activity of late was Nov 28, 40-10 Meters, Dec 15, 15 SSB, and Dec 20, SSB and CW on 40. New "extended" SSB activity is planned for late January and early February.

Tom Schreckengost, N4FJL, will operate from three Caribbean islands in conjunction with his work...St. Maarten PJ7 Feb 10-13, Antigua Through Feb 17, then J87BT, St Vencent, Feb 18-24. All modes including RTTY on 40-10 Meters.

ARRL's Board of Directors is expected to make a decision on just who will be the new Headquarters general manager actually before their March meeting, by mail. This may free up some of the meeting time for them to tackle the "list and net" issue, if they feel the urge. The proposal made to the DX Advisory Committee (Issue 125) specified the lower 50 KHz of 10, 15, and 20 Meters only.

Karl Renz, K4YT, says his government trip to Africa (Issue 120, page 2) has been postponed until around the end of March. When he finally leaves the order of stops will be as published earlier.

And Dieter Loffler, DK9KD, confirms the earlier reports that the 3Y Bouvet operation they had hoped would come off this winter is postponed...they have "definite agreements for transport" for late 1982/early 1983. "No safe transport was available this year."

IDXF (International DX Foundation) is indeed looking into a possible Navassa operation this spring, but they will make no announcement until things are "concrete." They do say that the chances now look good, and mid-March is their target.

Steve Gregory, VK3OT, confirms his upcoming operation from Cocos-Keeling, where he will sign VK9YT Feb 24 to Mar 10, from the home of Mike, VK9ZYX. He will be 40-10 Meters, both SSB and CW, appropriate frequencies and optimum times. Steve says mail pilferage in his part of E. Australia is a problem, and asks that no callsigns or other mention of amateur radio appear on your envelope. Send to Steve Gregory, PO BOX 622, Hamilton, Victoria, Australia 3300. After the Cocos operation, Steve will activate VK9XT Christmas Is, same bands and modes.

Lloyd and Iris Colvin, W6KG and W6QL, respectively, made 9,000 contacts with 144 countries as W6QL/8R1 Guyana through Jan 11. It took them three weeks after arriving to get operating permission and to have their radios released from Customs. They think they were the first aliens to obtain such permission, which came after a number of officials had laid hands on the documents. (The Colvins are now signing W6QL/PZ1 from Suriman).

DK2OC still tries to bring YI1AS to his 28740 gathering on Fridays, which are Albert's only day off work. He may show as early as 1000Z this spring, but of late he has been scarce even on Fridays.

Jose M. Ahumada, LU2DX IARU liaison Radio Club Argentino:

Ref Issue 124, page 2, and the subject of various countries' claims to the South Sandwich Islands...

"The South Sandwich Islands do not belong to a certain
country; they are claimed by several
nations, including Argentina and the United Kingdom. From Argentina's point of
view, they are part of the Austral Islands
of the Argentine Republic. Neverless, I
do believe this is a subject that cannot
be solved by radio amateurs, but rather by
our respective governments. It is my understanding that this subject is already under
consideration by the U.K. and Argentina.

"In 1956, I, along with other Argentine amateurs, was issued the call LU2ZY, and this was the first operation by radio amateurs from the South Sandwich Islands. The Islands were immediately recognized by ARRL for a new DXCC country.

"In 1976, the Argentine Navy established a scientific base on Merrell Island, Thule Group, South Sandwich Islands. This permanent base is manned year 'round, and the official base callsign is LU3ZY. This station has been active recently.

"Ron Szama, LU2A, is at this time touring the islands in the Antarctic and has been issued callsign LU5ZY for use from the South Sandwich Islands. He expects to operate from them if weather permits.

"The calls LU2ZY, LU3ZY, and LU5ZY are duly-licensed stations by the Secretaria de Communicaciones, which is the branch of the Argentine government that issues amateur radio licenses. I hope this clarifies misunderstandings in recent bulletins."
