And to subscribers: every time a copy of TDXB goes through a photocopy machine or into the Interoffice Mail it lessens the chances that we will be able to continue.

W4LZZ, operating at 3X1Z the past few weeks, said on Feb 10 that his next stop would be home, not any other African countries. But someone else noted that he had said he might swing by Mali, TZ, on the way.

Bob Black, WA4SKE, who had hoped for operating permission in Mozambique at the end of March (TDXB 128) received a Telex from their government reading "We inform that the amateur radio service is suspended in Mozambique." Bob will try to break things loose when he gets to Zimbabwe in March. If the Telex is true, this would put a cloud over recent and upcoming C9 operations by Swedish amateurs. SM2DWH/C9 cards have now been received by most of those who worked the two-day operation back in December.

An official announcement just arrived concerning last weekend's Rivilla Gigedo expedition...they had planned on the calls XF4MDX and 6J5LM (SSB only), the special call in honor of the 50th anniversary of the LMRE (Liga Mexicana de Radio Experimentadores). QSLing info was to be announced later.

Following West Kiribati T3ØBO, PAØGMM was scheduled to activate E. Kiribati as T32AE through about Feb 16 or so. His favorite place is 14202 at 0500Z.

ZS2BK is testing and breaking in the TS-130S which will go to Andy, ZD9BV, later this month. It was mentioned that Andy has a receiver and has been doing some listening already, to familiarize himself with hamming procedures. Look for his operating to start about Mar 1.

RUMORS of a PYØ Peter and Paul Rocks by Brazilians and a certain K5 appear to be unfounded; the time frame being mentioned was the end of this month. Talk persists of a Trindade operation by PY1RR and others for the end of March.

We are awaiting word from VK2BJL concerning a Mellish Reef operation in May. And there is nothing coming through from either P29JS or SVØBV about Heard Island for this year, although now a cost figure of \$100,000 is being bandied about.

KF10/CEØX QSL cards are not yet in the mails, and no matter because ARRL is still not making any decision on whether they would count for DXCC...but they are leaning toward NOT accepting the operation, on the basis of evidence presently on hand.

The CBS news show "60 Minutes" featured a Morley Safer special on the S. African "homeland" of Bophutswana on Feb 7; this excellent show demonstrated why ARRL is not considering any of the so-called "homelands" for DXCC credit.

Word from Italy was that a SMOM 1A0KM operation was to take place the weekend of Feb 13/14, but a station signing that call was worked by many on Feb 9, on 10 Meter SSB and 15 CW. No indication of legitimacy.

A letter from 9G1RF stated that the new government in Ghana, installed Dec 26, was putting all amateurs off the air, and indicated that the situation might be a long-term one.

Martti Laine, OH2BH, finished his CR9BH operation and left some RTTY equipment with both Simon, CR9AN, and with Tim Chen, BV2A (who has been conspicuously absent from the bands of late). RTTY addicts are also advised that Everett Jackson, WA8CZS, will be making a lot of teletype noise from Anguilla (see Calendar). He won't have a VP2E callsign until arriving there.

W7PHO says FB8WG missed two recent "promised" skeds, on 14225 at the usual time of about 1500Z on Feb 7 and 8. However, Georges was found by a lucky few on 14,111 on Feb 9; they called him on CW and he answered on SSB. This was his scheme back in December.

DP0LEX, a German Antarctic expedition by DL6RK and others until 1983, got off to a bad start when their ship, the Gottland II, ran aground last week.

TDXB Issue 127 (Feb 1) was mailed Friday, Jan 29; if you didn't get it, please send an SAE...we'll pay the postage. This issue will be mailed on schedule Friday, Feb 12.

KH3AB of last year is now NR4K, and he handles his own QSL cards, as well as those for presently-active KA6HIQ/KH3. Do NOT send cards to KB7MO.

HH2JR now says HH0N QSLs for last June's operation will be printed in two weeks (they don't count for DXCC).

There is still time to send a letter to ARRL's DX Advisory Committee about list and net operations...here is the text of the form letter you will get in reply:

"On behalf of the Headquarters and the DX Advisory Committee, I would like to acknowledge your letter regarding list operations, a copy of which has been sent to each member of the DXAC.

"During 1978 and 1979 the DXAC studied the question of whether contacts made by list operations should count for DXCC credit. The conclusion was that they should count even though lists are NOT the preferred method of operation. An operating guideline (sic) was written and published in the September 1979 QST. I have attached a copy for your information.

"Please accept my apology for this form letter. The volume of correspondence coupled with my lack of a word processor or secretarial service prohibits a more personal reply. The members of the DXAC are reviewing the letters being received, and your opinions are valued. Thank you for your concern and support of the DXCC program."

ARRL's Board of Directors were in attendance at the Miami Hamboree last weekend, and they interviewed finalists for General Manager, but no decision was made. They might take a straw vote by mail prior to the March formal Board meeting, but no announcement would be made until the meeting itself.

Steve will sign VK9YT and another operator, anonymous at this point, has the call VK9YM. The two will leave Mar 10 for Christmas Is, 400 miles to the East, and will run two stations...look for VK9XT, VK9XM, and/or VK9XI. Plenty of CW activity promised, especially on 40 and 80 Meters.
