### BY 1PK

Kan Mizoguchi, JA1BK, a well-known DXer and former JARL director, visited China and BY1PK on May 11. He filed the following report, which will appear in greater detail in the May issue of the Japan DX Radio Club magazine. This viewpoint provides an interesting contrast to the ARRL/IARU report published in TDXB last week.

The BYIPK station ceased operation on April 18, after twenty days and some eighty hours of operation. Station Manager Tong, along with two other operators (one man and one woman) made 256 contacts, all CW, including 130 Japanese stations, thirty countries (real countries, not DXCC countries) and they worked all continents except Africa.

At this time, operators from a number of cities, including Chungking, Nanking, Shanghai, and Kwangchow, are being trained in Beijing by Tong. This training will take some time, after which the new amateurs will return to their home cities to begin operating, presumably using club stations already initiated by Tom Wong, VE7BC.

There will be no operation on SSB until early 1983, primarily because none of the first operators have much command of English, the language common among hams. The Chinese government has authorized operation on all amateur bands 3.5-28 MHz, including the new "WARC" bands at 10, 18, and 24 MHz.

JA1BK says he spent time explaining DXCC and other competitive activities to Tong and others at BY1PK, as well as letting them know about the tremendous demand around the world for contacts with China. Kan reports (contrary to the

IARU view last week) that the Chinese seem quite interested in such activities as contesting.

The equipment at BY1PK includes a Kenwood R-1000 receiver, a Yaesu FT107, a Chinese receiver "No. 7," a U.S.-made linear amplifier, and a Hy-Gain TH6DXX. As only straight keys have been available to the BY1PK operators, Kan left them a Japanese squeeze keyer and paddle by JA2JSF for them to use.

It is suggested that QSL cards go to Box 6106, Beijing, PR China. IRCs are good there. The operators there are aware that their callsign has been bootlegged, and they have been getting QSLs for some of those contacts. As a good will gesture, they are sending a picture postcard in reply, so that those disappointed at having worked pirates will at least get something from China.

While China is off the air for the time being, this was planned all along. The first twenty days of operation were to acclimate Tong and others at BYIPK so they would be prepared to train other prospective amateurs. Although no time frame for reappearance of BY stations has been announced, indications are that sometime after Tong's visit to the Yugoslav Foxhunt in July is likely.

### ALBANIA

It is no coincidence that renewed amateur radio operations from Albania are being rumored just as China is coming back on after a very long absence, Albania being China's closest ally. Reports from a num-

ber of sources hint at upcoming ZA operations, possibly as early as late summer or early fall. This would put Albania back on the air about the same time that China makes its big splash. Already, contacts have been made in Tirana by EA2AJH, and several well-known European DXers are trying to push the door open a little more. One of them is EA8AK, fresh from the recent VK9ZR operations, and Fernando speculates that initial ZA operations would be highly restricted, possibly to just the exchange of callsigns and signal reports.

FINAL STATISTICS from Mellish and Willis: VK9ZR Mellish (by VK2BJL, DJ9ZB, and EA8AK) made 16,824 contacts, 60 percent SSB and 40 percent CW. Fully half of all contacts were with the United States, one quarter each with Japan and Europe, and five percent the rest of the world.

VK9ZR/Willis was a slightly different story, there already being some activity from Willis on HF SSB...80 percent of the VK9ZR /Willis two-ways were on CW, with emphasis on the low bands. Bravo!

REPORT ON DON RIEBHOFF, K7ZZ, in a recent issue was about 90% correct. Don leaves the States for Iraq almost immediately, but he did not do any language preparation (this time). It seems that Don, ever the diplomat, was never able to bust loose even a visitor's operating permit during the couple of years he spent in Czechoslovakia, and he probably did no operating even from club stations. His OK8 license was in the works when the U.S.S.R. invaded Afghanistan, at which time the Russians put out the word to their satellites to make things difficult for visiting Americans. Perhaps Don's luck will be better in Iraq. But...

WITH THE IRAQ/IRAN WAR now almost a year old, any YI radio seems less than likely. From Iran, however, Toshi, EP2TY, has been appearing more frequently once again. He shows up often on the Russian DX Net, which meets at 21250, 1400Z, Wednesdays and Fridays. The net also does 20 Meters, 14250/1600Z, same days.

On May 21, the Russian DX Net was wiped out by the Woodpecker.

K9AJ ASIA OPERATION IN PROGRESS; we got notice of this too late for last week's issue. Mike McGirr (a medical doctor) has been active as 4S7AJG and he'll be operating from Nepal as 9N1MM until about June 2. After that, Mike will activate a 8Q7 call from Maldives June 4-8.

Mike saw our note a couple of months ago about 4S7WP wanting a vertical for low band operation, and he took a Hustler vertical to leave there. Mike used the Hustler and an IC-730 while there. Sri Lanka pickings will be slimmer after Aug, as that's when 4S7MX is due to leave.

Catch K9AJ's operations on CW ONLY... from all three spots, and QSL like this:

9N1MM to N7EB 4S7AJG and 8Q7\_\_\_ to K9AJ home adr.

Here's what the TDXB POLISH DESK had to say about Martial Law as it relates to SP amateur radio: licenses were indefinitely suspended and equipment was indeed confiscated and put in "obligatory Customs deposit" (i.e., stored in military warehouses) with no assurance that the rightful owners would ever see their gear again. "Many people have their objections against this proposal; for instance, congestion of the 14.150-14.200 segment, which is in use for DX by the rest of the world. The Americans expect to overrun us with their number of stations and the kilowatts."
