PROPAGATION: Jun 14, Low/Below Normal; Jun 15, Low Normal; Jun 16, 17, High Normal; Jun 18-20, A ove Normal. TNX N4XX.

The solar flare on Sunday, Jun 6, was the most intense since July, 1978. Although the HF bands were wiped out for hours, 50 MHz was extremely good, with 48 of the fifty states heard in the Northeast, along with some fifteen countries, mostly in the Caribbean. The Midwest and West Coast were treated to several ZLs

N4XX is still predicting above normal conditions for both days of the All Asia phone contest Jun 19/20. During that activity, U.N. Headquarters station 4U1UN will operate "all bands" to work Asians.

CANADA's ST. PAUL ISLAND

The all-important landing permission from the Coast Guard has now been received for a major operation from St. Paul, July 8-13. Operators will include VEIFH, VEIAMC, VEICER/AK4L, VEIASJ, WIXX, AA2Z, and KIWJ. It will take some doing to work this operation on "all bands," as they'll have gear for 160-10 Meters, 6 and 2 Meters, and 432 MHz, as well as RTTY and possibly SSTV gear!

During the IARU Radiosport Championship, two multi-operator, single transmitter stations will be in operation, signing VEISPI and VEICER. Operations on 50 MHz will be signing VEIASJ and non-contest operating before and after the weekend will use VEISPI.

QSL information will be announced later. VHF operators desiring EME schedules on 2 Meters (only) should contact Jerry Hull, AK4L, at 203-666-1541, 8-5 Tues-Fri.

DR. SAN HUTSON, K5YY, is off again, this time on vacation to St. Vincent, J8, Jun 19-24, then St. Lucia J6, Jun 25-29. He will work mostly the low bands and CW for those needing 5BDXCC contacts, etc. After that, San will be in Brazil a few days, to look into possible future operations.

W4MGN OFF TO AFRICA AGAIN

Dr. Ed Richmond's summertime trips to Africa have become an annual event. This year he leaves Atlanta mid-June for two months of operating from a dozen spots, including several rare ones. Ed operates "contest style" and mainly 20-10 Meters, but he will do the low bands when the host station is set up for them. These trips are in conjunction with reaearch projects for Ed's university, so amateur radio is done when time permits. The schedule:

"We are delighted to know that finally the ARRL has officially announced that contacts made with KF10/CEØX will not count for DXCC. for the sake of truth, let it be known once and for all that:

- R. Read has never been on San Felix Is.
- 2. His transmissions took place from continental Chile.
- 3. He was never granted a contract by the Chilean Naval authorities.
- All the documentation presented by him was either FALSE or FORGED.

"We deeply regret that a U.S. citizen and amateur radio operator has been responsible for this matter."

A few weeks ago in discussing China and Albania we referred to them as "allies."

That was not meant in the military or treaty sense. Probably a better term would have been "ideological soulmates." TDXB hopes we did not offend any of our many Albanian and Chinese subscribers.


