CHINA: further information from JA1BK (ref TDXB 143) says the period of "desk training" for the operators may be complete by now. Some are saying that BY1PK is back on the air now, although we have no first-hand reports. Listen for a straight key (although JA1BK left them a keyer) on 15 and 20 Meter CW at 0700Z and 1400-1600Z.

DF8MP/XZ has not been showing for Saturday morning 15 Meter list operations. See our comments in Issue 144. This (and other Burma operations) won't be counting for ARRL's DXCC, but CQ magazine has just announced that XZ5A and XZ9A QSLs can now be counted for both WAZ (W4KA) and for the CQ JX Award (N4UF). Although they didn't mention it, this decision probably also means that if you worked XZ5A or XZ9A in the 1981 CQ Worldwide DX Contest they will count for the Burma multiplier.

Argentinian stations are now back on the air, although they seem to not be working the US. Several have been heard calling "CQ, no US." With the cessation of hostilities on the Falkland/Malvina Islands Jun 15, and the possible change in the ruling junta, Argentina's amateur radio future is still in some doubt.

Erik, SMØAGD, has not been heard from in almost two weeks. He was last in the Cook Islands and hoping for either Tokelau or Baker KH1 (which is greatly needed).

A new "Sinbad Net" featuring Oman stations is scheduled to begin in July, tentatively. Eight contacts with A4s will get you a new award (yet to be announced). These actions are by several of the many writish and American amateurs stationed and working in the oil-rich sheikdom. They are working with the locals and two "natives" reportedly are ready to come on the air.

While figures on the number of such aliens in Oman are not available, there is such information on several of the neighboring countries. For example, 85 percent of the United Arab Emirates population is made up of foreign workers. In Kuwait, 60 percent, and in Saudi Arabia 40 percent. The foreigners make up 95 percent of the labor force in the U.A.E.! (figures from the July issue of Atlantic magazine).

Jim Smith VK9NS and wife Kirsti VK9NL will operate from E. Malaysia 9M8 for about three weeks, beginning Aug 15, CW and SSB.

VK9ZH's last day on Willis will be Jun 25. Until then he is on 3695 daily at 1000Z.

ZL40Y/A QSL manager asks for patienct as he (ZL1BQD) is four months behind in answering cards. OD5LX says the Beirut post office gives only 1/4 the value of IRCs, so he suggests you go through SMØDJZ, his manager. Nothing coming through from DK2OC on YI1AS contacts late last year (has anyone gotten a YI1AS card from another source?). VK9JW Mellish Reef (1972) should still be obtainable from W8CNL. 3CØAC/BC cards from last winter's Henson operation now showing (via WB4ZNH).

Plenty of BANDPASS on FB8WG again this week; Georges has now been there about ten months and the talk is that he might leave mid-July. When he showed on the Open House Net last week (14332 at 1000Z) about half the stations listed did not know that he was coming through on the Long Path. Beware!

Never-Say-Die rumormongers are now slating an Albanian operation for August 4-5. If a full-bore operation by outsiders is to take place, we expect to have advance (and definite) word of it.

To those of you who received early renewal notices for July and August: it would be greatly appreciated if you'd send your renewal soon, so we can avoid mailing another notice.

We are trying to get the 1982 Countries Needed Survey results tabulated in time for July 1 publication. This year's accounting should be more interesting than ever before, because we can relate them to two previous surveys. We will put an asterisk (*) on Mellish Reef, as it was on the air while the survey sheets were out. We are also not going to tabulate 8Z4, Serrana Bank, and Bajo Nuevo, because they are expected to be deleted by the end of the summer. We estimate that about 700 of you (40%) returned your survey sheet this year.

Believe it or not, quite a few of you have asked what happened to our "equipment reviews." In the past year we have had only two radios, the KWM-380 and a TS-830S, both of which were reviewed. We presently don't even have an HF rig in-house, but are hoping to get something new to try very soon. No idea what it might be, though.

Editorial True Confessions

Maybe you're like me. You've been a ham for two decades and never set foot on the 2 Meter band except for the occasional repeater. Last fall, I bought an fm radio to listen to the one and only DX repeater within range. To my chagrin, not only did I find the fare there of no interest personally but the chatter contributed nothing to putting together this paper every week. I chucked them when they "autocalled" half their members to work a nonexistent Malpelo station.

Just before last weekend's ARRL VHF QSO Party, two kind souls loaned me 1) a multimode 2 Meter transceiver and 2) a homemade amplifier. The logical thing to do seemed to be make the 14-element "Junior Boomer" into a workable antenna (although it's just on the roof of a one-story house) and jump in. To say the operator was somewhat ignorant of 2 Meter DXing would be an understatement. One of the local radio Gestapo promptly tried to shoo me off 144.200 when I tried a CW CQ there. That was before the contest!

Well, it's been a long time since I could say I worked "seventeen new ones" in one weekend, but I did just that last weekend, as I picked up seventeen states (21 ARRL sections) plus VEl and VE2. I know that's hard to relate to if you live in Montana but heck, I can just about see six sections from my hilltop here. Being a true DXer, I only made about a hundred contacts, since I concentrated on multipliers. Both tropo and aurora reared their heads, and I managed to get as far as two contacts in North Florida. The locals say that's not bad.

I heartily recommend trying something like this if you've run out of countries to chase on the Low Bands. It's hardly a "new frontier" now that you can plug in commercial rigs on 2 Meters and operate just like HF, but the operating is (was for me) almost like being a novice again.

The KITN Operator Skill Postulate Number One has always been "If you are a skilled CW operator you are automatically a skilled phone operator." We are now prepared to announce Postulate Number Two: "If you are a skilled operator on one band, you are a skilled operator on all bands."

Incidentally, I found the contest operating on 2 Meters to be excellent, both on CW and on phone. Sure, there were a few CW ops who sounded like they must have found their Technician licenses in a box of breakfast cereal, but you can hear that on 20 Meters. For the most part, stations were fast and efficient. They tell me that 6 Meters is not so good, with much of the "20 Meter syndrome" appearing on that band. Maybe I'll give it a whirl in September! - KITN.
