TOP TEN NEWS

Several Australians have reported working BY1PK between 0600 and 0800 on 15 and 20 CW. The station does appear to be active again (by the three original, primary operators) but we've had no North American reports on them.

"VU7MA" was worked by a number of stations on July 4, the operator claiming to be a Japanese named Jab and saying QSL via JH3QFY. It is speculated that he was aboard a ship in the general area of the Laccadives. If so, he was probably fending off pirates.

A recent Indian visitor to Atlanta said he and his wife (also a ham) had applied for an Andaman Islands permit about a year ago, and they are hopeful of eventually operating from there.

Two different groups are still making overtures toward Albania and (still) talking about early Fall. That would be the tenth anniversary of the last operation (ZA2RPS) from Albania.

Last year we mentioned that the Columbian amateurs were hopeful of running an expedition to Malpelo in honor of a regional IARU meeting to be held there early next year. They are now looking at the latter half of 1983 which would also coincide with the fiftieth anniversary of their national organization, LCRA. This operation would be limited to LCRA members because the Columbian Navy (which provides transportation) requires insurance, and the LCRA can insure its own members only.

September is the most likely month for the operation, and proposed operators are already promising to pay special attention to working W6/W7, many of whom missed out last time (in 1977) because "the rock" was between them and HKØTU.

Incidentally, when the LCRA held its annual general meeting last month, they registered their opposition to deletion of Bajo Nuevo and Serrana Bank from the DXCC list. They have expressed these sentiments to ARRL but it is clear that the two spots no longer meet the Countries Criteria and an exception would have to be made to keep them from being deleted.

Heard Island plans for Jan/March 1983 continue, spearheaded by the "VK6 DX Chasers Club" and the two major U.S. DX Foundations. We will carry a full report next issue; for now, your contributions to either IDXF or NCDXF will help to make Heard a reality next year.

OTHER NEWS

Market Reef OJØMA is on tap Aug 2-12, with George Wagner, K5KG, and Finns OHØNA, OHØNC, and OHØRJ. They will work the WAE CW Contest Aug 7 and 8. and concentrate on SSB the rest of the time. QSL OHØNA.

Karl Renz, K4YT, finally got squared away and left for his assignment in Africa Jul 1, first appearing from TYA11 two weeks ago. TYA11's antennas came down July 15 and Bull leaves for the States on the 22nd. K4YT's next stops (depending on workload) are Nigeria, Camerouns TJ and CAR TL.

HSIWR, Brig. Gen. Kamchai Chotikul, who died Jun 15, was a leading force in keeping amateur radio alive in Thailand. He will be long remembered for his efforts, which resulted in HS calls being on the bands when none of the countries around Thailand were having anything to do with amateur radio. Kam took over the Radio Amateur Society of Thailand in 1970, when of its twenty members only two were Thai citizens. He built the Society to where there are now two hundred members and 95% are Thai.

We had mentioned that VK9JW Mellish Reef cards from the 1972 operation had come from VK3JW, which was true, but, sorry to say, VK3JW died in 1976. It is not known if anyone is handling the QSLs these days.

ZC4BI is G3KGB and he will be active two years, with plans to have Low Band antennas up before fall. 9J2WS will move to Sierra Leone and 9L1WS in October, with 160-10 Meter activity planned.

9M8PW has a schedule with his QSL manager, G4DXC, Mon, Tues, Thurs, and Fri, 14266 at 0830Z. FRØFLO is rumored planning an FH8 Mayotte operation in September.

A35MW (DJ1WM) and A35WH (DJ9KH) are active until Jul 26, then they plan operations from ZK2, ZK1, ZM7, and FWØ. QSL to each operator's home call.

Faroe Islands Jul 22-Aug 2 includes Swiss HB9CJX, HB9CGC, HB9BPU, and HB9AQW, all /OY. CW 25 KHz up and SSB at the usual spots. HB9AQW, incidentally, reports he got a QSL from the Aug '81 VU7AN operation, which does not count for DXCC.

K5YY's operations from J8 and J6 netted seven thousand contacts, with concentration on CW and working DX. His total for nine DXpeditions since 1970 is now 73,000. San spoke to radio clubs on both St Lucia and St Vincent, with about fifteen locals showing for each meeting.

Get ready for the Pacific Operations coming next month by George Adkins, ADIS, and his wife Vicki, N5DLM. Check Calendar for pertinent dates. They have requested permission to operate 10 MHz CW from E. Carolines (KC6WS) and from the Marshalls (KX6OS). Since these are now independent republics and not bound by the U.S. Senate's failure to ratify the 1979 WARC treaty they may have a chance.

News of the resignation of W8IMZ as CQ WPX Contest Manager was untrue, as the Contest Calendar editorial in the next issue of CQ will show. Bernie is joined now by N8BJQ in handling the two weekends of the WPX, a contest which has grown considerably the past few years.

One recent RUMOR which didn't produce anything was that a group of Vietnamese would activate a 3W8 callsign this month (where do they dream these things up?). Another story has Dale Hoppe, K6UA, bound for Bangladesh and trying for an S2 CW ticket. One story which is true is that the contest station of W7KW (including a 3.5 MHz rotary) is coming down and will be transported to a certain location in the Houston area.

N5FG is working on a listing of "last legitimate operations" from the most-needed DXCC spots, and we are trying to help out. We'll have complete rundown on the project next issue.

Speaking of projects, the Great K1TN 2-Meter incursion has now resulted in 20 states, after a recent E Skip opening during which we got Minn, Wis, and Iowa. We have sampled three modes of propagation (E, tropo, Aurora) and are hoping to try the meteor shower early next month before giving up the borrowed gear. We did not hear VEISPI on 2, but a bunch of the locals did work St Paul on 6 Meters.

From ARRL Director's Letter, 7/9:

"FCC TO PROPOSE CODELESS AMATEUR LICENSE.

"As reported via WlAW, on July 1 the FCC instructed its staff to draft a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking dealing with a codeless Amateur Radio license. The NPRM, which is not expected to be released until the fall, will propose to remove the code requirement from the present Technician Class license for operation above 50 MHz. The present Technician

Class license, requiring code and permitting access to the Novice bands, would also remain. The NPRM will also explore the possibility of a codeless digital license similar to that already offered in Canada... The ARRL Board is, of course, on record as opposing the issuance by FCC of any amateur license with no requirement for a knowledge of the Morse code."

Editor's note: don't make comments to FCC or ARRL until the actual NPRM is released. Both <u>CQ</u> and <u>73</u> Magazines have already come out <u>in favor</u> of a codeless license.
