ERIC

Having SMØAGD operate from a rare spot is like throwing a party...lots of people show up and almost everyone has a good time. When you read this Eric's T31AE/SMØAGD/KH1 operation will probably be gone but not forgotten. American Samoa and Central Kiribati, numbers 33 and 46 in the 1982 TDXB Countries Needed Survey, will have been scratched from most DXers needed lists.

Eric's pattern of SSB operating, listening up at 5 KHz intervals, met with mixed reaction. The technique lends itself to 10 Meters and probably 15 but not to the other bands, where there is less space to spread out in. The technique may be something future operators may want to experiment with.

Eric should be showing from E. Kiribati and T32AE about this time; it will be the last stop on his current tour. All QSLs to SM3CXS.

HEARD ISLAND UPDATE: We are going to put off the special VKØ issue one week, because things are starting to happen in terms of licensing, landing permission, and operator selection. The WIA/VK6 effort (assisted by IDXF and NCDXF) has waited until all was set before starting their major fund drive. That drive begins now and must be completed by Nov 15. As for the VK9NS Jim Smith effort, it continues amid speculation that the freighter he has chartered does not have the fuel capacity for the round trip to Heard. Details next week.

DXCC NOTES: A gremlin crept into Issue 162,

in which we said G3JKI/5A QSLs are accepted for DXCC. They ARE NOT.

Deletion of Bajo Nuevo, Serrana Bank, and the Saudi Arabia/Iraqi Neutral Zone has finally become official. This goes right along with one of our TDXB Official Rules of DXing, which states that "whenever a DXCC entity is deleted, you will have it both worked and confirmed." The current countries total is now 315, the lowest it has been in some years, and 306 will be the bottom spot on the Mixed and Phone Honor Rolls.

QSL NOTES: FB8WG cards are coming out for June contacts now. 5T5TO's manager, F6BUM, is no good in the latest Callbook. Don't send cards there until a correct address appears here. And KX6AA's manager, W4NT, isn't working, either. F6ATQ reports that he has just had cards printed for last spring's J2Ø/Z Abu Ail operation, and will begin sending them out soon.

Ministry of Silly Rules Department: it is reported that U.K. hams now have limited access to the 18 and 24 MHz bands, allowed CW only, 10 watts input, and horizontal antennas only (to minimize ground wave). The aerial must "have a maximum gain of less than 0 dB over a half-wave dipole."

Don't forget to listen to WIAW on Oct 28, to find out when the release date for 10 MHz (in the U.S.) is. Ref Issue 162.

This week's Calendar has what we hope is the most complete listing anywhere of \overline{CQ} WW Phone Contest operations. No guarantee that all will show, though.

Last-minute additions to the WW Phone listings include W3BTX/PJ7, who will put in limited time in the Contest, and a rumor that N2KK will be in Djibouti to sign J2ØLN. Bill Ovca, NIGL, will be portable 6Y5. Last year Bill placed third in the world, operating HI8PGG, and the two above him, 9Y4VT and EA8AK, were both "3point" countries (to the States). It should be a fine tussle between NIGL/6Y5 and ZF2FL (N6RJ).

Stu Perry, WIBB, will not be putting out his 160 Meter newsletter this season; Stu was hospitalized this past summer and is still recovering at home. It is possible that someone will step in and help sort things out and get something in the mail to the Late Night Crowd.

The High Speed CW Club will send operators DL8MK, DF8ZH, DL1RK, and I2XXF to Cyprus, where they will sign DLØHSC/5B4 for three weeks starting Oct 24. Look for them at the very bottoms of the bands. They'll need high-speed code with that callsign!

OHØW (Issue 158) is "ready for action," according to OH2BH. They made 5,000 contacts during their warm-up session last month in the SAC event. Henry and Dentron amplifiers have just arrived on the island for the 35 operators expected for the CQ Phone contest. They'll be on all the usual frequencies, including 1831, 1916, 3645, 3785, 7040, and 7085. Their sunrise and sunset times are 0553Z and 1443Z the weekend of the contest. A "king-sized QSL" is offered to everyone working them on five bands, and "something special" for anybody who makes it on six.

Wayne Green, W2NSD, publisher of 73 and a multitude of other magazines, has just left for Asia. His first stop is Seoul, Korea (HL9WG), after which he'll stop in Taipei and look up Tim Chen, BV2A/B. After that comes Singapore, 9M8 (license promised), the Seanet convention in Bangkok, then VS5WG Brunei, 9M6, and home. Look for Wayne on phone.

DK6XR and DK7XN will fire up from Rotuma Island beginning around Oct 27. The island is part of Fiji, and the callsign will be assigned when they arrive in the capital city of Suva. It might pay to work this one, as there is a long-shot chance it could count for something other than Fiji. Without going into the intricacies of the appropriate DXCC rules, suffice it to say that the first step toward DXCC acceptance is for an operation to tak place. After about a week's operating on the usual spots (split mode) the pair will activate FWØXR/XN for another seven days. QSL to DK6XR, Holger Rambatz, Heidlohstrasse 35, D-2000 Hamburg 61, W. Germany.

The French Grape vine says F6BBJ and a friend are off to Africa soon, to try for operating permission in the Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, Mali, Togo, Benin, Equatorial Guinea, Annobon, Sao Tome, and Niger. Late October is their expected departure date.

5R8AL has reportedly left Malagasy for a two-month period. 5A1BQ's "manager," AA6AA, knows nothing about him. The Clipperton operation formulating for November will be headed by several Tahitians, whose FO8 licenses give them a decided advantage. A certain local W1 has license in hand for a go at HC8 end of November (for the CQ WW CW Contest). 4U1ITU mid-October was by DF3EC and DF3EK; QSL any 4U1ITU Oct 10-16 via either DF home call. TT8LM was supposed to show Oct 20 on 20 Meter SSB, with the list-makers poised and waiting; operator said to be TL8GE for a three-week stay.
