CHINA: JAIBK came on from BYIPK as predicted Sunday, Nov 28, at 0000Z. He transmitted on 21150 and listened for West Coast stations on 21200; you had to be within range of the northern California repeaters to know where to transmit! A number of W6 stations were worked, as well as many JA stations. We know of no other time over the weekend that BYIPK was active. BY8AA maintains 15 Meter CW pretty much on schedule at 0100Z several times a week, and has been worked on 40 CW also. No reports of any BY8AA QSLs coming through yet.

MEARD ISLAND: in Issue 164, TDXB Recommended interested DXers make donations to the January 1983 operation of the "VK6 DX Chasers Club," via either the IDXF or the NCDXF. We made that decision purely on the assumption that if the Heard operation did not materialize your money would be put to use for some other worthwhile purpose. It is noted that neither foundation has sponsored an operation from a truly "rare" DXCC country in some time. For our effort, TDXB has not received any acknowledgement of our endorsement from either foundation, or from Australia.

The other impending Heard Island expedition, by the Heard Island DX Association (Jim Smith, VK9NS) procedes apace. Smith is now in Tasmania, overseeing the

preparation of his vessel, the Cheynes II. His list of eighteen operators will be released next week and we will publish that list. Kirsti Smith, VK9NL, now has her license for Heard, VKØNL, and a third license, VKØSJ, has been issued for use only when operating maritime mobile enroute to Heard.

Smith denies accusations by others that his ship is unfit for the trip to Heard; authorities in Australia have granted landing permission based on use of the Cheynes II. Smith has also contracted with those authorities to replace the government weather station on Heard Island. While the Heard Island DX Association can still use additional financial support, Smith is determined now to make the journey regardless. His scheduled departure date remains Jan 1/2.

DXAC Acts on Rotuma Island: the 3D2XN operation the first week of November, from Rotuma Island by DK6XR, will not count as a separate DXCC country, ARRL has informed DK6XR. Their letter states "The proper criteria for islands located adjacent to another island group with common government is Countries List Criteria 2b. This requires 500 miles of open water separation. Rotuma Island, being separated from the Fiji Islands by only 260 miles, does not meet this (sic) criteria. For this reason any QSOs made with Rotuma Island will be credited as Fiji Islands."

W5BE/HR6 in the CQ WW CW Contest was from Barbeta Island, a 5X3 mile private island about 65 miles NE of Honduras. It simply counts as HR but was a nice contest multiplier. And wasn't it GREAT to hear Polish hams back on again? Their first day of operation seemed to be Nov 26.

NEPAL: Operation Dec 15-Jan 1 by W60AT/9N1, W6YOU/9N1, WB4NFO/9N1, and JI1VLV/9N1. This visit is by "royal invitation" to participate in the national celebration of the King's birthday. The group will be signing 9N38 Dec 28,29, and 30. They will be using four each IC-740s, LA-1000 amps, and Hy-Gain TH2 beams. IDXF president John Ackley, KP2A, had planned to make the trip but was waylaid by business commitments. QSLs to WIGAY.

NOTE plenty of choice Bandpass on the low bands this week, thanks to a new subscriber up in the wilds of New Hampshire. We are sure he will write with a story of how he does it...there's really no mystery, though. Run a KW to a vertical or sloping full-size dipoles, and use beverage antennas on the quietest piece of real estate you can manage. Get away from power lines and all other sources of noise.

Out of Europe come rumors of a Mount Athos operation in Dec or Jan, but the source is notoriously unreliable. JTØGM (UV3GM) hasn't said how long his stay in Mongolia (Zone 23) will last. There is still talk of a full-bore JT operation or perhaps a UAØ Zone 23 operation by some Russian club members, in January or February (if they didn't burn themselves out with all the /U6G etc operations). Another rumor from Europe is that some Argentinians will activate S. Orkneys in January.

VEIASJ had to cancel his FP8 operation slated for the CQ WW CW weekend...his company had workers on strike and Andy was pressed into service unexpectedly. LA7Y is at EA8QO for the winter. 5R8AL is back, with a sked on Mondays and Wednesdays, 1800Z on 21330. You can slip a 2X CW contact amongst the slopbucket if you are quick.

YIIBGD is active on 10 and 20 SSB, in the 12-1600Z slot and sometimes with JY3ZH on 14220 at 0630Z. The signal is better on 10 than it is on 20. Your editor slouched up to 14201 in the midst of the CQ WW CW Contest on Nov 28 and snagged Iraq 'barefoot' for country number 303 (after deletions). We were running about 50 watts output on SSB, which only proves anything's possible if you believe in magic!

20 METER BEACONS: (ref Issue 168)...one of the locals reports hearing the 4X4TU/B beacon last week, but quite weak. Expect the additional beacons to be coming on any time between now and the New Year. We are trying to get a photo of one of the transmitters to publish here.
