HEARD ISLAND: not much to report except that the CW pileups are slowly dwindling, while SSB pileups for VKØHI continue to be ferocious. VKØCW operates around 14.020 and still listens as high as 14.070, even though the pileups have only been 5-10 KHz wide the last few days. Alan has been telling people who call twice that he's already worked them...he is either 1) keeping a dupe sheet, 2) has a good memory, or 3) hasn't made very many contacts! The correct answer is probably 2.

Dave, VK3DHF, has been thrown to the lions on 20 Meter SSB. VKØHI operates almost exclusively 14.195 and listens above 14.200. The Heard Island expedition Newsletter #4, dated just as the ship left Australia, sheds some light on operating tactics: they are going to make a point of operating transceive briefly but felt that would probably have to be done by the "list" method. VKØHI will also listen above 14.280 for U.S. General class phone operators, and they request that those with higher class licenses refrain from calling above 14.280 (!).

Nothing has been heard of the Jim Smith ${\tt HIDXA}$ expedition as of Thursday, Feb 3.

CHINA: BY1PK has disappeared completely from the bands. BY8AA still operates on 14.050 at about 0045Z several nights a week. It is not possible to tell if he (they) are on by listening for a pileup, because there is lots of blind calling every evening. Their chirpy signal is pretty well cleaned up so its hard to find them among the people calling either them or VKØCW. To tell you the truth, it's a mess.

MALPELO: a very strong rumor coming out of Colombia is that a Malpelo operation will take place late in March. Past practice has been one Malpelo operation every five years and they're a year overdue. We await word from the TDXB Bogota desk.

CHAD: TT8AC and TT8BC completed their operation Feb 1. FCC released their no-code license NPRM Feb 1, and the introduction is exactly the same as TDXB published on January 10 (Issue 173). FCC denied ARRL's request for an 18-month stay of execution. They said "The ARRL has, in RM 4229, invited upon the amateur community the burden of the operator examination program." The League had asked for 18 months to get the volunteer examination program running before having the added task of administering new code-free tests, but FCC wasn't buying.

In its discussion section of the NPRM, the Commission said, in effect, that CW is still unique (in that you can operate CW on any frequency), and that CW "can stand on its own feet" as a communications mode. That is, anybody who wants to work code can continue to do so and will not be affected by the codefree amateurs.

POLAND: some Polish hams are coming back on just in time to work Heard, but hamming there is drastically changed from pre-Dec 1981. Not all individuals are going to be re-licensed, and some club stations are also kaput (several SP9KRT members were jailed during martial law). Many of the club stations of the national organization, PZK (stations with P-suffixes) will be replaced by military club stations with K-suffixes. It is thought these moves are aimed at doing away with PZK, an ARRL-type organization over 50 years old.

RANDOM NOTES

First nomination for callsign of the year goes to Fred Kleber, K9VV; Fred will operate from Grand Turk Island Feb 16-26 and has been assigned the call VP5FUX. Fred asked us to spread the word because he figured people'd hear him and not believe he was legit. QSL manager is KB9AW. Fred will be in the ARRL SSB DX "Test as K9VV/C6A, QSL to K9VV.

Portuguese hams are using special prefixes as follows: Jan-Mar, CQ; Apr-June, CS; Jul-Sep, CR; and Oct-Dec, CU. In honor of 1983's World Telecommunications Year.

Colombian hams are also using special prefixes this year in honor of the 50th anniversary of their national society. All are in the block 5J and 5K.

Wondering about all the activity in the South Atlantic? RSGB's DX News Sheet says Great Britain is exercising sovereignty over the Falklands, So. Georgia, and So. Sandwich, so only VP8 callsigns are valid from these islands. The So. Shetlands, So. Orkneys, and the Antarctic peninsula are under international treaty and any country can, in effect, issue licenses for these spots. You may recall that TDXB carried information on the South Atlantic in Jan/Feb 1982, and within a month there was war!

DK2OC Net has switched to 21305 at 1230Z, due to the downturn in 10 Meters.

Issue 173 (January 10) carried a tentative list of DXCC countries which were not on the air in 1982. We erred on a few of them, to wit: FB8ZQ came on late in December, 1982; KC6 W. Carolines was activated by ADIS/N5DLM; KH6IMX/KH4 was briefly active from Wake; we said KPl when we meant KP2 Desecheo, which stays on the list; and TI9FAG's operation in the Fall eventually was found acceptable for DXCC.

This means that all but thirty eight DXCC countries were on in 1982, i.e., you could have worked 277 for the year. ARRL's bulletin of Jan 28 says that "A6XWT has been heard on CW making lists for himself." Will someone please enlighten us as to just how one makes a list for one's self?

Heard on 21.290 at 1900Z: "The OM Inter-national Society." They have numbers, just like the YLISSBers, and they were madly exchanging them.

There's a rumor that W6KG and W6QL are looking into the possibility of a North Yemen 4W license. They'll go there instead of Bahrain if they can operate.

Don't waste any time working FB8XAB, as he may leave even sooner than his scheduled Mar 1 departure date...and some are saying that Jim Smith wants to stop at Kerguelen on his way back from Heard (if he makes it to Heard) .
