

HEARD ISLAND 1983...GONE, BUT NEVER TO BE FORGOTTEN!

PROPAGATION: Feb 20-22, Low Normal; Feb 23, High Normal; Feb 24, High/Above Normal; Feb 25, High/Low Normal; Feb 26-28, High Normal; Mar 1, High Normal; Mar 2, Above Normal; Mar 3, Above Normal/Disturbed; Mar 4, 5, Disturbed. TNX N4XX.

BANGLADESH: Late word and a revised schedule from Kazunori Abe, JA8MWU...he and JH8NYK have been operating 9NlWW since Feb 7 and are finished in Nepal Feb 20. They hope to open from Bangladesh Feb 21, until the 26th, as \$21MM and \$21WW. Unfortunately, the political situation between India and Bangladesh has heated up the past week, possibly putting a crimp in their plans. The two are now scheduled to operate 8Q7JA from the Maldives Mar 2-16. JH8NYK may have his own callsign, 8Q7YK. QSL info to follow next issue.

HEARD: about all the information we have is that both groups appear to have left Heard Island around Feb 15. The mountaineering expedition, of which VKØHI/CW were a part, finished their climb on Saturday, Feb 12. Both groups reported rapidly deteriorating weather. Band conditions were so poor that both groups were stuck mostly on 20 Meters, and the two station sites were only about a half mile apart. The H.I.D.X.A. operators, five in all, found themselves sitting on their hands much of the time, with no bands to operate on. Complete QSL information appeared in recent issues of the Bulletin.

Koln, West Germany, Feb 7: members of the Cologne DX Group will activate Peter and Paul Rocks Mar 4-8. Operators will be DK9KX, DJ9ON,DF9KH, DL8CM, and an unnamed Brazilian. QSL information not given but assumed to be Dieter Loffler, DK9KD. TDXB will confirm that next issue. They will appreciate donations to help with costs.

And an even Bigger Flash: the same letter advises an operation at the end of March to a very rare DXCC country. The operation will be for five days, beginning Mar 22 or 23. DK9KD asked that we not publish the details until after March 1, and we of course respect his request.

Looks like we may have to delay the TDXB Annual Countries Needed Survey until mid-April, as there are going to be a lot of people working new ones in March. And it also appears this will finally be the year when your editor makes the Honor Roll. Neat!

ARRL has just announced that the new manager of their Technical Department will be Paul Rinaldo, W4RI. He is currently editor of their <u>QEX</u> newsletter for experimenters. He will be taking over when current Manager Doug DeMaw, departs in May.

A FEW WORDS ABOUT YOUR SUBSCRIPTION. Bear with us on this...a lot of people ask the same questions and we are spending entirely too much time writing letters. Second-class mail service continues to leave a lot to be desired, and we would be happy, to tell the truth, if everybody just paid the extra for first class mail. But keep in mind that subscribers who don't need any countries are just happy to get the Bulletin whenever it comes, so second-class is fine for them. If you want the <u>Bulletin</u> on time, first-class mail is worth the extra seven bucks a year.

The recent rate increase brought all three levels of subscriptions into line, profit-wise. We were especially taking a beating on the airmail subscriptions. Beleive it or not, <u>TDXB</u> is a full-time sole source of income for this editor, and we cannot afford to imitate the Salvation Army (as others do). We try to put out a superior product to justify the slight difference in price of our newsletter.

When you send in a renewal and switch to first class mail, it sometimes takes us several weeks to actually switch you over, because we process all renewals for a given month at the same time. We don't cut anybody off until the very last minute.

Finally, last week both our primary addressing machine and our identical backup machine broke down. The issue got out on time but the problems are going to continue, because, to be honest, we have just about out-grown our equipment. We would like to slow things down a little, so please don't send any money until you get a renewal notice. And we would just as soon you not mention TDXB if you can avoid it. When our advertising runs out in two magazines, we are not going to renew it. We are no longer going to offer multiyear subscriptions. If you are rich and can bank the additional money, you break even on multi-year payments. In the case of TDXB, we have lost.

Doha, Qatar, Feb 6: Our operation as W6KG/A7 ended 5 February 1983. We were on the air three weeks and made 8,000 QSOs, with amateurs in 135 countries, working SSB and CW on 10 through 40 Meters.

This country is similar to Oman because it is a recently rich oil country with tremendous new expansion. Although the treatment of women here is more liberal than in the past, only approximately 5 percent of the people seen on the streets of the modern city of Doha or in the restaurants are women. The biggest supermarket in town has one day set aside just for women and their families. It is not felt appropriate to have single men and single women go shopping together!

For the first time ever, we operated from a skyscraper building. Our antennas were located on top of a 14-story hotel with a perfectly clear view in all directions. The great height seemed to help us on both transmission and reception; we averaged consistently about two QSOs per minute while on the air.

Visiting personnel of all kinds, and especially radio amateurs, are not encouraged to visit in the Arabian countries. We are

extremely grateful to Mike, A71AD, who has helped us enter and operate in several Arab councountries.

Steve has just learned the code and is working 20 CW with help from more experienced operator VP8AQU. They're using a transceiver without remote vfo, and when they say "up 4" that's as far as the RIT will allow.

VP8AQU will be reassigned at the end of Feb, either home to England or to South Georgia. Unfortunately, his memory keyer will leave with him, so get S. Orkneys on CW now if you need it!
