CHINA TAKES BALL, GOES HOME

IN JULY, 1982, one Hoo Na, a young Chinese woman, came to the United States to play tennis, discovered double Cheese Whoppers taste better than rice balls, and decided to change her address. Last week the U.S. granted Hoo Na political asylum, and the People's Republic of China retaliated by cancelling, for the rest of the year, all "cultural exchange" programs with the U.S.

It is unlikely that this "setback," as Henry Kissinger called the cancellations, will have any effect on the amateur radio operations which began about a year ago in China. China classifies amateur radio as "sport," not cultural exchange, as do most Communist countries. Visiting Americans have not been allowed to operate from the two active stations, BY1PK and BY8AA, anyway, so nothing will change on that front. It will take some time to see if any word filters down through the bureaucracy to the amateur stations concerning contacts with the U.S.

The last time either station was reported was March 30.

20-METER PHONE BAND EXPANSION COMING!

THE FCC voted March 31 to expand the 20-Meter 'Phone band for U.S. amateurs, per the recommendation of ARRL (and others). Extras get 14150-175, Extra/Advanced get 14175-200, and General/Advanced/Extra get 14200-350. The expansion will be effective thirty days after publication in the Federal Register. FCC is also still considering phone band expansion proposals on other bands.

The only complaints heard so far have been from a few isolated Advanced class licensees, as they get "less" than Extras and Generals. Although both Advanced and Extra licensees picked up 50 KHz, only Extras got an "exclusive" segment.

SPRATLY: latest word (April 7, 1500Z), from NØZO/DU2, was the Spratly group (see previous issues) would arrive there Friday, April 8, for a 3-4 day stay. If band conditions continued as they had the previous several weeks, the only openings to most of North America would be 20 Meters 1200-1500Z and possibly 15 Meters around 2200Z.

Speaking of Spratly, the impending operation reminds us of several questions people have asked, and we can address them together at this time. Spratly is a long haul from the East Coast U.S., and band conditions have been miserable lately. They are merely a portent of the next six years or so. We are thankful that the Spratly group includes experienced operators who are good on CW, because it may be critical that they pick times of good propagation to population centers and work only those areas. Inexperienced operators can, and do, often ignore short openings out of ignorance.

Regardless of what anti-CW people may say, that mode can get you through when SSB will not. Real CW operators understand that. If band conditions are really bad, the only chance many of us will have for a 2-way with Spratly will be on CW, and we are glad that DJ6SI, a fine code operator, is a part of the group.

Further...now that Extra class operators will have an exclusive segment of the 20-Meter phone band, they may be able to work some rare DX which is unavailable to other license classes. If the new 20-Meter phone segments were in effect today, and the Spratly group decided to spend a very short period of time on SSB, at, say, 14160, guess who would have a shot at them. Now that's incentive.

Our point is...if you are dead serious about your DXing, you'd better have an Extra Class license, and you'd better be able to work CW, particularly as conditions deteriorate. If you have an opposing viewpoint, let us have it.

BRIEFLY NOTED

New operator at the Polish base on Svalbard is SP5DED, signing JWØP. QSL manager is believed to be LA5NW (we're checking). Perhaps 250 SP licenses were reactivated for the SP DX Contest the weekend of Apr 2, and some of them continued operating into the following week. Keep in mind this is 250 out of about 7,000 SP licenses before the USSR rolled in.

DAYTON HAMVENTION CW copying contest (see TDXB 184) will not be having an assault on T.R. McElroy's record, says the latest W5YI Report; WB7VKI is now saying that he can only read in his head at the 70+ wpm level. Shucks, almost everyone knows that the hard part is transcribing to paper, and many of us can copy 70 wpm in our heads. C'mon, Jerry!

Another shot at Canada's St. Paul Island may take place this year. The effort last July netted 14,000 contacts, but 12K of them were with North America, and the need is still great, especially in Asia.

Other publications are touting another Mt. Athos operation this spring, but we have not had our usual official word from IØMGM yet.


