DXCC NEWS

ON RECOMMENDATION of their DX Advisory Committee, ARRL has approved DXCC "country" status for Peter I Island. Administered by Norway, Peter I is off Antarctica, NE of Thurston Island, in the Bellinghausen Sea. Peter I will not be added to the current DXCC list until after an operation takes place from the island.

The DX Advisory committee, after reviewing the case for Spratly, has called for a Committee vote on whether or not to recommend it be deleted from the DXCC list. The vote is expected in August or early September. If the Committee recommends deletion of Spratly, a decision would be forthcoming from Headquarters soon thereafter.

JIM SMITH, VK9NS, says he has "limited permission" for a Kermadec operation. He is negotiating for a stay of at least one week. Contributions to H.I.D.X.A., PO Box 90, Norfolk Island, South Pacific 2899.

IAØKM came on as promised Jul 9/10, sticking to CW much of the time to avoid the Radiosport Contest QRM on SSB. This will be the last S.M.O.M. operation until at least this Fall, perhaps later. QSL IØMGM.

ARRL WIAW bulletin of Jul 8 says that "KIMM has been invited to operate BYIPK.
Bill will be the first U.S. amateur to operate from BYI since 1948." KIMM was in Beijing last Spring and visited BYIPK.
There is no time frame nor other details of the possible operation at this time.

A6XJC, the only currently active U.A.E. station which counts for DXCC, seems to like weekends, SSB and lists only. Try around 14250-260 and 21300 from 2200Z to 0100Z. Lists are run by WA3HUP, WB3CQN, and others. From now on, QSL via WB3CQN.

S2BTF is showing on the 14225/14227 gathering at 1500Z or so, but does not count for DXCC at this time. ARRL has requested documentation from Peter.

Holland's <u>DXPress</u> says T3ØDB is planning a Canton Island operation the last two weeks of August, and will sign both T31 and KH1. "He is now waiting for support from the various DX societies." Activity will be both CW and SSB, "all bands."

Recent heavy activity from Nauru is due to a number of fresh licensees, says Kenny, C21KH. All new C21's will be listed in the '84 Callbook. The two-mile diameter island's only industry is the mining of phosphate (contained in bird guano). Tell 'em you read that in TDXB. The supply is expected to run out in 7-8 years.

WHEN ACTIVITY picks up in the Fall, we would like to have more BANDPASS reports, especially from the Central and Western areas. NOSTALGIA CORNER

BACK IN ISSUE 181, we published an only partly tongue-in-cheek list of how declining sunspots build stronger DXers. More and more, we are asked if TDXB will flop when radio conditions get worse and worse over the next five years. We confess to not being sure. Our predecessor on the West Coast had his big period of circulation growth in the late 1970's, as propagation conditions were improving; he had already been publishing almost ten years.

What follows will not be news to Old Timers, and is intended for those who are new to DXing. We thought it would be interesting to have a look back at our logbooks from one sunspot cycle (eleven years) ago. In the summer of 1972 we were just getting back on the air after college, and our DXCC total from pre-college days stood at a commanding 120! We were not on the air during the great sunspot peak of 1967-70. Between the summers of 1972 and 1973 (when we moved from Indiana to Connecticut) our DXCC total rose to 220. Then we lost interest, because at that time you couldn't "transfer" DXCC from call area to call area, unless the move was less than 175 miles. Our interest was rejuvenated when DXCC "Rule 9" changed and we could combine our Indiana and Connecticut efforts. We didn't get really serious (as in making sure to not miss anything) until we started publishing TDXB in the summer of '79.

That last summer in Indiana, just eleven years ago, we had a small amplifier and three element beam at 40 feet. Looking through our log from that period, the most striking thing is the virtual absence of 10 Meter DX. Oh,
there were days, but 15 and 20 carried the load.
We were on the air almost every day, and during
that summer one cycle ago we worked the following new countries: 3B8, C21, VR1, 5N2, SV/Crete,
9X5, TR8, C31, A2, 9V1, CR7, 9M2, XW8, VQ9, UM8,
FM7, MP4 (A9), UH8, 9N1, YB, 3B6, TU, 5R8, and
EA6. All this was in July and August, none of
them on 10 Meters them on 10 Meters.

In September, as we awaited the opening of Ten, we picked up CEØ Easter, OY, 3%, HH, ZK1, and 5V7. A KH6 finally got into the log on Ten on Sept 27, followed by CN8BF, ZK1CD, and a few stray Europeans. Fifteen and Twenty were still hot, though. On Oct 7 we exchanged 579's with JH1VOE on Ten Meters, and that just about exactly correlates with when Ten Meters opened to Japan in the Fall of 1982!

In those days I wasn't particularly interested in the DX Contests, but I did get in the \underline{CQ} WW Phone at the end of October, 1972. Ten Meters produced 96 contacts in 42 countries, including all continents and some Asians. Sorry to say I find almost no Ten Meters in the log in November 1972, and in the CQ WW CW at the end of that month I worked 15 Meters only.

All this seems to reinforce what we've been saying to some of the newcomers lately...15 will be fine this autumn, and 10 Meters will have its moments. This will be $\underline{\text{The Year}}$ to make sure you have your 100 countries and forty zones on 10. If a few of you have found this piece interesting, we can carry it on into 1973 in a subsequent issue. Don't lose hope...in April, 1972, we visited K4ID in Tennessee, to pick up a radio. When we glanced at his logbook for the previous couple of months we were astonished to find it full of Asian contacts on 20 Meters! Of course, Don had a Telrex beam at a hundred feet or so. At the time it looked like about a thousand feet. You don't absolutely have to have something that big, of course, but it does help!

Oh, yes, I should mention that during that time in the early 70's, I did not subscribe to a DX newsletter. If I had, I'd have worked XU, ZA, both VU7s, 70, 3Y, and Kermadec. And at this point I'd have "all" but a couple of the DXCC countries, instead of still needing ten.





