PRIBILOFS: ref Issue 205. It turns out that the Alaska DX Association sent their "case" for DXCC status directly to certain members of ARRL's DX Advisory Committee. Unfortunately, this is not how the system works. Such material should go to ARRL Headquarters first. Then, the advisory committee Headquarters Liaison (in this case Don Search) sees that, if necessary, each committee member receives a copy of the material. As of this writing, Headquarters has not received the material.

THE NEW "INDXA" NET is meeting mostly week-days on 14.235, at 2330Z and again at 0200Z. They take "lists" only after the desired DX station has arrived; the first couple of weeks have featured 9NlMM, FH8CQ, and TN8EE. They are hoping to entice 5R8AL into participating soon.

DL7FT has officially advised his correspondents that Albania is off again this year. We are still hopeful that efforts of the Finnish society, led by OH2BH, will bear fruit soon.

"RAPA ISLAND," southwest of Papette, was the site of recent FO8JD/R and FO8BI action. They would like to see separate DXCC status for the

spot, but that seems unlikely.

ZKIMA by ZKICY started Aug 29 and will be a six-week North Cooks operation, according to DXPress. Says he will work "mostly CW Mondays and Fridays, SSB on 14.310 at 0300Z." QSL ZKICY.

BY1PK has, according to VE3FRA's DX Report, invited VE3LEH to visit and take a keyer with him. Trouble is, VE3LEH admits to not being a CW operator. This will be in late September.

Although propagation has been adequate on 15 Meters the past few weeks, BY1PK has not shown at all and BY8AA has appeared briefly about twice a week, always around 21.040 between 00 and 02Z. QSOs last at least five minutes, not the least of which because BY8AA insists on giving their mailing address with every contact!

We are continually asked for tips on working the elusive Chinese stations. Aside from listening early to get them before the pileup grows, we suggest some callers should read any good operating manual for CW pileup calling techniques. Even if BY8AA or BY1PK works a station on their own frequency, do NOT follow the lead and call them there. Too many people are doing this, resulting in mass confusion.

As for propagation indicators, here in the Northeast on 15 Meters we have found BY8AA coming through just after the JA stations have dropped out, with UAØ stations often coming through concurrently with BY8AA. The openings to W1/W2/W3 are normally very brief as the skip moves West across North America. On at least one occasion, after the brief opening to W1/W2 the band died and no one else could hear BY8AA. We hope all this is of some help to you.

DX News Sheet says FB8ZP, the only station on Amsterdam, is QRT; the operator "had an accident repairing his antenna and has returned to France for treatment." Nothing heard from either FB8WI or FB8XAB for some time, either.

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ABOUT PETER I. Island, which will become a new DXCC country as soon as somebody operates from there, we have been informed that WB6ZUC, who happened to stop there on a ship cruise not long ago, showed slides of the island last April at the Dayton Hamvention. It turns out that it is possible to land a boat at Peter I. Of course, the weather there varies from bad to miserable year 'round, putting it in the Heard Island/Bouvet category.

GUIDO, PAØGMM, will try to activate Macau CR9 Sept 27, for three days or so. Look for his 'phone on 14.200, 21.300, and 28.600.

ARRL reports A6XJC is back after a visit to Germany. He likes 21.300 around 1800Z, although he is very hard to catch. This is another one the new net on 14.235 (page one) may try to snag.

LORD HOWE ISLAND is the goal of the "Down Under DX'ers Contest Club" for the CQ Phone Contest (last weekend of Oct). Using VK2WU/LH, they'll be on 10-160, with 75 Metre work on 3695, listening 3805. US QSLs to WA2BFW, others to VK2WU.

YOUR EDITOR regrets he will not be attending the ARRL National Convention in Houston next month, despite rumors to the contrary. Look for us at the YCCC contest club meeting Oct 1 in Hartford, and at the NE DXCC meeting in Boston Nov 5, though. As much as we would like to attend far-away events, finances simply do not permit it. Think back ... during the long tenures of such luminaries as QST's "How's DX?" editor W9BRD and the WCDXB editor WA6AUD, how often did you see them at DX conventions?

In Burundi, U.S. Ambassador Jim Bullington (formerly TYAll) is still trying to get a license before this year's contest season fires up. In both these cases, U.S. personnel are going strictly "by the book" in licensing attempts. K4YT's tentative schedule appears in the Calendar.

While amateur radio is technically non-political, that is a pipe dream. The best example was when K7UGA was the Republican nominee for President of the United States. QST opined that while it would be marvelous to have a tribander atop the White House, they steadfastly refused to suggest that amateurs vote for Barry simply because he was (is) a ham. QST was right, and Barry was probably the first to agree.

While the heavy hand of politics has always laid on some countries, the U.S. has generally avoided restricting its amateurs. As WW 2 heated up in Europe, isolationist sentiments still ruled in the States; many U.S. hams were heard calling "CQ, no belligerents." The matter was, of course, eventually settled when amateur radio was completely discontinued for the duration of hostilities.

Some countries restrict their amateurs today...an example currently in the news is Taiwan, which does not allow its amateur(s) to QSO Mainland China nor any of the U.S.S.R. "republics." The Italians visiting there next week will be under those restrictions. Most Arab countries are not allowed to work resident Israeli amateurs (although visitors signing portable 4X are OK).

Until about ten years ago, the U.S. maintained a Banned Countries List. This was not really of our doing; FCC merely was answering the fact that some countries had informed the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) that their amateurs were not permitted to contact amateurs in other countries. These banned countries were mostly in Southeast Asia, and if you worked them you were not breaking U.S. laws, except that, again, technically, we are not supposed to work "pirates." Of course, you can't tell from one day to the next if a station is a pirate

Generating a "Banned List" would be easy for FCC to do today...they could start with Burma and Mozambique, for example. FCC's refusal to do so predates the current moves toward "deregulation" of the amateur service by many years.

So if you feel like not working any Russian stations for a while, that's fine. It's a free country. Let's hope the inevitable sickos who deliberately QRM and otherwise cause trouble will be few and far between. They are a blight on our hobby. It is not necessary for us to be "above politics" (if you are above politics you are dead). Let's demonstrate that we respect others' rights on the ham bands as much as we claim to respect and support human rights everywhere.
