JARVIS/PALMYRA IN NOVEMBER

AD1S/KH5 will begin about Nov 5. George Adkins, AD1S, and other operators to be announced later, have firmed up transportation and other arrangements. Jarvis, about 1200 miles SSW of Hawaii, counts for Palmyra at the DXCC Desk.

Jarvis is a wildlife refuge, 2X1 mile, and is administered by the U.S. Dept. of the Interior. Resident population includes hermit crabs, feral cats, and 1.5 million birds (in two square miles???). The expedition will be made up of five amateur operators and a government biologist, whose expenses are being paid by the hams. The Interior Department has issued a special-use permit for the visit.

The expedition will leave Christmas Island, Republic of Kiribati, on Nov 3. The stations will operate five days, barefoot but with beams, both CW and SSB on 10-160 Meters. Financial support is being provided by the Northern California DX Foundation.

KERMADEC

Jim Smith, VK9NS, and his Heard Island DX Association continue arrangements for next February's trip to Kermadec. There will be five scientists and four radio amateurs going. In this case, the permit for the stay on the island is being negotiated by one of the scientists...the amateurs will accompany them. However, transportation arrangements are being done by the hams. The group will be able to stay in a building on the island of Raoul. Jim says the building will accommodate ten

people, not necessarily in comfort! Plans are to stay eight days.

ANOTHER SEMI-REGULAR ODDS AND ENDS ROUNDUP

You should already know this, as they are on the air: the St. Paul operation is signing VYØSPI. They got notification of the change when they got to Nova Scotia.

Sounds like U.S. ambassador Jim Bullington, N4NX, has finally got permission to operate from Burundi. Look for him soon.

St. Kitts received their independence on September 18, and they should be signing new callsign prefixes shortly.

Marshall Islanders voted on Sept 1 to end their association with the U.S., except in defense matters, says UPI. If (when) the U.S. Congress ratifies the new agreement callsign changes will probably be in order, although there'll be no change in DXCC status.

Always a big moment in the DX World is crowning of the DX Hog of the Year at the W9DXCC Convention. On Sep 17, 1983, Dr. Mike McGirr, K9AJ, received the honor. Rumors are it was Mike's successful quest for 5 Band WAZ that put him over the top.

VK9NS's 14.220 Net is gathering steam once again. Jim conducts it every Saturday at 0700Z, but indications are it may be run on a daily basis (as in the past) before long. Jim says during the time he ran the net from Papua New Guinea (P29JS) some 270 DXCC countries checked in, and he estimates that some 150,000 "transactions" took place.

G3XTJ passed away recently; he was QSL manager for a number of stations, including 6Y5FS. We suggest you not send any cards that direction until alternate arrangements have been made.

Word is going around that Venezuela's Radio Club will celebrate their 50th Anniversary with a trip to Aves Island next February. It will be three days, including satellite operation.

VE7BC says he will be in China again around Oct 4, and we might listen for him on SSB. Although we have heard that story more times than we care to count, there might be a little more to it this time, considering K1MM's operation last May and the upcoming BY4AA operating by JH1ZCT in Oct (Issue 207).

LAST ISSUE's mention of Spratly, of the ARRL DX Advisory Committee vote, concerned whether or not to delete it from DXCC status. The DXAC is not involved in approving or disapproving the 1S1CK operation of May, 1983. The October issue of 73 Magazine has part 2 of DJ6SI's Spratly saga, plus photos and an article on the ISICK visit.

I2MQP/BV (they didn't have to sign /BVØ after all) came on on schedule Sep 19, amid dismal propagation. A good opening to U.S. East Coast took place on 20 Meters Sep 21, but only lasted an hour. The opening on the 22nd was even shorter, and nothing was doing on 15. The opening on the 21st was I2MQP's 40th birthday!

K4YT left J28ED Sep 18, proceeding to the Seychelles, then to Kenya. There will not be any operating from 7Q7LW's Malawi house. Incidentally, 7Q7LW made his first appearance on 40 Meters last week, on a schedule. He'll probably do it again upon request.

FOUR YEARS AGO IN TDXB: In Issue 6, we reported on a radio demonstration made by JA6HOZ in Canton, China. He had been given verbal permission by local officials to operate on 14.120 MHz for an hour, and managed to work a few JA stations. Yuji had been doing business in China for some time and was well known in Canton. At that time his feeling was "we should not expect to hear him from China again, and that China was many years away from granting permission to its own citizens to operate ham radio."

Issue 7 had a detailed story on Spratly, just five months after the ISIDX operation in the spring of 1979. The story, from government sources, made it clear Spratly would be a dangerous area for any future operations. VQ9s KK, JJ, and MR had just completed an operation from Cocos-Keeling Island. Plans for a November operation from several Indian Ocean spots, including Glorioso and Juan de Nova, were revealed by N2KK, K5CO, and N5AU. We listed 48 callsigns as Contributors to that issue!

How were the bands? In a word, great! BANDPASS for that mid-September, 1979, period, included over fifty rare and semirare countries on 10 Meters, including deep Asians, the Cocos-Keeling expedition, YIIBGD, and Malaysia. 20 Meters was open round-the-clock, and 15 was usable about 18 hours a day. One year later, our mid-September 1980 BANDPASS listed 10 Meter stations in all continents but Asia, in less quantity than the banner year of '79. Mid-September 1981 showed 10 Meters open to Africa, Europe, Oceania and the Falklands, among others. The solar flux was running well over 200.

One year ago, 10 Meters had not really opened yet...we listed a smattering of Africans and that was it, except for the usual Central and South Americans. And 15 didn't look much better in September, 1982. Not much exciting on 10 was reported until almost a month later. When SMØAGD showed from T31AE and SMØAGD/KH1, 10 Meters was the place to work him (from N. America).

AD8J's Guadeloupe operation is deleted from the Calendar, for reasons which will become apparent in a couple of weeks. It's for a good cause!
