CAMBODIA

ON THURSDAY, OCTOBER 6, ARRL HEADQUARTERS announced that the current operations from Cambodia would count for DXCC credit. The decision was made about four hours after we went to press with Issue 210 (sorry). The two stations heard thus far are XUISS and XUIKC, with XUISS the most active. Japanese efforts to establish these stations were documented in TDXB Issue 204.

The political situation in Cambodia is as follows: 160,000 Vietnamese soldiers are stationed in Cambodia to support the puppet government of Heng Samrin. They have been there since Christmas Eve, 1978. There are three resistance groups: former leader (and mass murderer) Pol Pot commands about 30,000 soldiers; Prince Sihanouk (who ruled 1954-1970), has only a few thousand supporters; and Son Sann, who's K.P.N.L.F. membership has doubled in the past year to some 12,000.

When Son Sann began coming to the West for aid, the U.S. insisted the K.P.N.L.F. join in a coalition with Pol Pot's people, who still control Cambodia's U.N. seat. Son Sann bowed to the pressure, but when he visited the U.S. in September he went away empty-handed again. According to the New Republic, the U.S. "defends its diplomatic support for Pol Pot in the U.N. by arguing that it helps strengthen ties with China and prevents the Vietnamese from gaining diplomatic legitimacy."

So it is clear that the new stations, under control of Son Sann, are "legitimate" Cambodian stations, since Son Sann has tacitly joined with Pol Pot, who holds the U.N. seat. Comparisons with Burma (XZ5A, iZ5A, etc) are invalid, as Burma has only one government recognized by the international community, and the amateur radio

stations there are neither authorized by or even connected with the recognized government.

XUISS at Ampil appeared on 14.195 three days last week: Oct 10 and 11 on SSB, and Oct 12 on CW. There are about a dozen operators, working same-frequency. They can be heard in the Eastern U.S. long path starting about 1000Z, but they are generally not workable until about 1045Z. It is hoped that the Japanese, who set the station up in the first place, will be able to supply a remote VFO sometime soon. For now, the contacts go very slowly. The Cambodian operators show signs of rapid improvement.

CHINA

NEW STATION BY4AA opened from Shanghai Oct 12 but apparently the Japanese visitors were only authorized one day or so of operating time. Chinese operators there will have been trained at the BY1PK station. Their operating times and frequencies will probably be constrained the same as at BY1PK and BY8AA, i.e., "quiet hours" due to TVI considerations.

Although 15 Meters has been very open lately, BY8AA only shows about once a week there, and BY1PK even less frequently. Our mail has indicated the frustration with the VE7BC operating from BY1PK two weeks ago...a "chicken and egg" situation. Was the deliberate QRMing due to poor operating from BY1PK, or did VE7BC change his tatics in order to shield his Chinese hosts from what was happening on his SSB frequency?

MALPELO

HKØTU CAME ON on schedule Oct 12, with a fair signal on all bands, including 80. Late word indicated fifteen HK operators, including Capitan Herman Olarte, HK1QQ, Coronel Alvaro Martinez, HK3AVA, and the other thirteen titled "Doctor." They took brand-new TS930s and triband yagis. Two QSL routes have been heard: "Via HK Bureau," and "Via HK3DDD." The Bureau is Box 584, Bogota, and HK3DDD is Edilberto Rojas M., Apto 25827, Bogota. The operation is expected to end about Oct 17.

JARVIS/PALMYRA

Another official release from George Adkins, AD1S;

At least five ham operators will be joined by a U.S. Government biologist on November 5, 1983, for what may be the last trip to Jarvis Island (KH5) for many years. Jarvis has been the site of several biological and oceanographic studies over the past two years, but no amateur operation has occurred there since about 1957.

Palmyra was always an easier location for the elusive KP6/KH5 country, but now that Palmyra is "off limits" due to legal problems, Jarvis is the only island which counts as KH5 for DXCC purposes. (Palmyra is privately owned and the owner now refuses to grant landing permission, which is required by the DXCC Desk -Ed).

For years, Jarvis Island was frequently visited by the U.S. Coast Guard and Navy, including at least six licensed amateur operators, but no one took a ham station. Finally, the weather station closed, the lighthouse was de-commissioned, and now all is silent. Government and private studies around Jarvis have concluded, and it is unlikely that transportation will be available to take anyone to Jarvis in the near future.

In addition, the island is the nesting ground for up to 1.5 million gulls, terns, boobies, and other exotic seabirds, and the U.S. Department of INterior is not anxious to grant random permission for groups to land there, for fear of permanent damage to the delicate environment. Jarvis Island has been declared a national wildlife refuge, with "NO TRESPASSING" signs prominently posted.

The 1983 Jarvis Island group overcame these obstacles by inviting a wildlife biologist to accompany them, incurring the expense of a sloop from Honolulu to Christmas Island to Jarvis. The group must adhere to strict guidelines in order to operate without causing damage. The Grassroots DX Group was fortunate to locate a suitable vessel in Honolulu and a captain willing to make the long voyage from Hawaii to Kiribati to rendezvous with a ham expedition. The fact that the captain's name is Derek Jarvis helped to entice him to the island.

This historic effort to activate Jarvis will come in the shadow of similar 1983 landings on Heard Island, Peter and Paul Rocks, and Malpelo Reef. These are all DXCC spots which may not be activated again for many years. Special attention will be given to operation on 40, 80, and 160 Meters. No list operations, but some "bonafide" DX nets will be on the schedule. Emphasis on CW, too.

QSLs for AD1S/KH5 to AD1S, G. Adkins, PO Box 32735, Okla City OK 73123, except JAs may QSL to the DX Family Foundation of Japan. Donations to help defray the expenses of this DXpedition will be appreciated.

BITS AND PIECES

AT LEAST one DXer/stamp collector took exception to our suggestion about using the new U.S.P.S. electronics commemmoratives for overseas mail. Well, we guess there are some countries where anything fancy on an envelope might invite pilferage. Use your own judgement.

ZL1AMO IS STILL talking about Kermadec next spring, despite plans by Jim Smith's H.I.DX.A., not to mention the likelihood that ZL3AFH, who is there now, will eventually get on the air. ZL1AMO says any operations from Kermadec will probably use ZL8 or ZL9 callsigns instead of /K.

The ARRL DX Advisory Committee vote on Spratly was extremely one-sided in favor of keeping 1S on the DXCC list. Headquarters is still known to favor deletion...the few Committee members who voted in favor of deletion had talked personally with Headquarters personnel prior to the vote.

U.S. Ambassador to Burundi Jim Billington, N4HX, is finally on the air as 9U5JB. You are most likely to find him on SSB; QSL to ON5NT.

LU2DX writes that he will be using special call L2X from Argentina in the CQ WW Phone Contest at the end of this month. He also noted that at the IARU Region II conference last June in Cali, Colombia, a unanimous Resolution "condemned the Spratly tragedy." Didn't say if they were condemning the DXCC program, the operators who tried to activate Spratly, or whoever did the shooting.

Another operation the weekend of the \underline{CQ} WW Phone: T2YKC, T2ADX, and T2RAA, by members of the Osaka Japan University ARC (JA3YKC). They'll be on 80-10 Oct 26 to 31.

FOUR YEARS AGO IN TDXB: We switched to a new method of printing and mailing the Bulletin. After the first seven issues with help from friends in Houston, this was our "solo flight." 3CIAA was upcoming by a Spanish group (came off on schedule), and the first official announcement of an operation from Palmyra and Kingman was made: WA6YQW, WA2FIJ, K6LPL, W2TDQ, and K2HFX were on the team which was to meet with disaster once underway. We carried a 3page ARRL report on what was happening in Geneva, as our representatives prepared for the World Administrative Conference, which would begin the first of November, 1979. Your editor was so busy reporting on UØY from Zone 23 that he neglected to work them himself (which we are now regretting). Incidentally, nothing heard now (1983) from this group.

AND, LEST WE FORGET, TDXB Issue 8 reported that Tom Wong, VE7BC, had spoken to JA6HOZ (who demonstrated amateur radio in Beijing earlier), and that Wong had also made contact with Chinese officials about opening BY again. As we know, it worked!
