ULL BEFORE THE STORM... two expeditions on tap for the next couple weeks, one certain and one iffy. They are looking for a pair of 8875 tubes for a Dentron amplifier to use on 160 meters...otherwise word is they will do no work on Top Band. We think many would be able to hear them even if they ran only a hundred watts. ARRL says YV5DFI will be QSL manager.

ONE BREW TOO MANY 'EH HOSER? Department: VEICBK used the wrong callsign from Sable Island on Jan 26/27; he signed CYØSAB when Canada's DOC has assigned CY9SAB there.

Look for W2GD from 4U1ITU during the ARRL CW Competition Feb 18/19, concentrating 1 80 and 160 (at 0500Z).

G8GRN/5X continues on SSB only (see Bandpass); as someone pointed out, G8 3-letter suffix callsigns are VHF/UHF licenses, and the operator there does seem in the dark about HF practices. Europeans report him on a net/list operation 14.222 at 0600Z.

VK6LK clarifies his 160 Meter operating schedule...he's on 30 minutes before his sunrise time to 15 minutes after (about 2130Z now) and on weekends around his sunset time (1130Z or so). Mike says he made a longpath contact recently with WA2SPL, he thinks maybe the first ever L.P. contact on 160 Meters. He needs RI, N Dak, and Miss for 160 WAS.

We put the Vernon station on 160 during the CQ 160 Contest recently, our first Top Band DXing in a couple of years. Were surprised to find quite a lot of DX in the 1825-30 Window, listening on their own frequency. A lot of DX is also now found operating outside the window. Special thanks to the operator who called us a lid for calling YU3EF on his own frequency!

WB4ZNH, Carl Henson, reportedly left for Niger on Feb 6, intending to try for a 5U license upon arrival. Nothing heard as we write this, but Carl has a very good track record in such matters, so keep an ear open for this one. Still no word from KC7UU/5N about any 5U activity.

Texas DX Society assaulting Mexico for both CW and Phone weekends of the ARRL DX Competition, hoping to break the multi-multi records in both halves of the Competition. Twenty operators to be signing XE2FU, QSL to K5RC.

There is still much confusion about QSLing for VU7WCY; our letters to India have gone unanswered. Some sources are now giving a PO BOX 3755, Coimbatore, for VU2GDG. It is still not known if IRCs or dollar bills are preferred, and whether or not registered mail to India is required. For many people, this one QSL is going to turn out to be the most expensive they ever obtained. Finally, rumors of a third VU7WCY Laccadives operation in the next month or so appear to have originated on Long Island, and we put no stock in them (famous last words!).

YASME's Colvins Lloyd and Iris report they made 7,000 contacts from Lima, Peru, using 4T4WCY back in January. OA4OS helped with licensing and OA4BI loaned them his pent-house apartment for operating. At midnight on New Year's Eve, the lights went out all over Lima. This turned out to NOT be a quaint local custom...terrorists had dynamited transmission towers feeding Lima to make a point about something or other.

Another big package of Kermadec material has arrived from Jim Smith of H.I.DX.A., a very impressive collection of documentation. Still nothing definite about dates of an operation but mid-March to mid-April looks good. We are glad this is still in the works, otherwise we'd probably be having a nervous breakdown now over ZL8AFH, who's high on the TDXB Official Wastebasket-Kicking Scale.

A4XIJ, Secretary of the Royal Omani Amateur Radio Society, announces that Mar 9 to 26 all A4 stations are authorized to append their callsigns with "/GFT." This commemorates the "Arabian Gulf Football Tournament 1984," being held in Oman and including Iraq, Bahrain, Kuwait, Qater, the U.A.E., Oman, and Saudi Arabia. There's even an award... five contacts during the specified period, on different days, will get the sheepskin if you send extract of log and ten IRCs "or equivalent" to Awards Manager, ROARS, PO Box 981, Muscat, Sultanate of Oman.

VU2IF, operating ATØA from Antarctica, is suthorized to work Indian stations only in their designated band segments, but may work others anywhere, and he's authorized a Full Gallon. He'll be on until sometime next month.

JIM'S FEARLESS PREDICTIONS
ARRL CW DX COMPETITION FEB 18/19

TEN METERS: openings to Japan from the Western U.S. only, and then only marginal. Openings to the Pacific from all parts of North America, 2000Z to 0000Z both days. Openings to Central/South America during all daylight hours, peaking 2000Z East Coast, one hour later Central, and 2200Z West Coast. Band will open mornings ferst for ZS/East Coast, at 1100Z, followed by southern Europe (EA, I) at 1200Z. Central U.S. will get Europe starting 1330Z. East Coast will get all of EU, including Western USSR, while Central States will not get Scandanavia, unless band opens over the pole around 1900Z. U.S. West Coast will get Europe only under the best of conditions, peaking at 1600Z, possibly via the Northern Africa skewed path, and then only southern EU. The contest will open Friday evening at 0000Z with LU and PY stations S7-8.

Weekend, with openings similar to 10, only much stronger. U.S. East Coast will get Japan only on Saturday, 2130Z to 2230Z. 15 will open to Africa and EU in the same pattern as 10, only openings will be longer and stronger. There will be no long path on 15. VK and ZL will be workable in the Midwest and East Coast until 30 minutes after dark. UA9/UAØ stations from Zone 18/19 will show after the opening to Japan is over, and will be the only stations coming from the north.

TWENTY METERS: Signals to/from most areas will not be as strong as on 15, but will be more consistent, and there will be the usual long path. Several stations will work over 100 countries on 20, while only the biggest of guns will do so on 15. U.S. East Coast will have their best openings of the contest to Japan on 20, at 1100-1230Z both days. VK and ZL will come through almost 'round the clock, including all night.

FORTY METERS: KIXM will work 80 countries on this band. U.S. West Coast will work many Europeans in the morning on the long path, and Midwest stations will run large numbers of JAs in the morning. The first Europeans will be worked from Boston at 1900Z, and California and points north will run JAs until 1600Z.

FEARLESS PREDICTIONS

(continued)

EIGHTY METERS: Just like 40 Meters, only less. 1984 will be the best year for 80 Meters in some time, although it will be noisier for the contest than it has in past weeks. U.S. East Coast will work VK6 long path starting at 2130Z both days, and there will be at least four or five JAs workable each morning from the East Coast. West Coast stations will work Europe only on Saturday evening. Conversely, East Coast will work the Pacific mostly on Sunday morning, as the competition subsides. One of the ordinarily easiest to find will be one of the hardest this year...LU.

160 Meters: someone will work 45 countries on Top Band this weekend; it will be a W1 or W2. The band will not be nearly as good as it was in January. The "Window" will continue to be crowded with North Americans calling DX on their own frequency, out of necessity. At least one multioperator station will forget to listen for JAs above 1950 KHz!
