CLIPPERTON EXPEDITION is still on tap as this is written (Mar 15), with all fourteen team members in Manzanillo, Mexico, awaiting arrival of their sailboat. Problem is, there's no wind. They have been looking for a faster boat locally, without success. Either way, expected departure date for Clipperton is Friday or Saturday, Mar 16 or 17; a fast boat will put them on the island the weekend of Mar 16/17, slow boat to Clipperton would put them there about Mar 21 or 22. Because of the delays, it is possible that one or two team members will have to drop out due to other com-There is no truth to rumors that mitments. the group's license or landing permission will run out if they don't get there soon. DXCC HONOR ROLL DEADLINE is March 30, and your QSLs must have been received in Newington (not postmarked) by that date! This is for the listing which will appear in July QST (see IDXB Issue 223). New "counters" are TN8EE, TOXB ISICK. Newington is being coy about accepting the new VU7WCY cards...send them in anyway. Newington also denies rumors that something might be happening along the lines of accepting QSLs from Burma's Karen State XZ5A etc operations.

KERMADEC EXPEDITION was scheduled to leave New Zealand Mar 11, 4-5 days in transit, and may be on the air when you get this sheet. Operators are ZLls AAS, AMO, BQD, and ZLØAJW. who anticipate a ten-day stay. Heard Island DX Association President Jim Smith, VK9NS, in a Feb 22 letter, stated his reasons for pulling out of the expedition...mostly they center around his wishing to conduct a "group operation," using one "neutral callsign" and a neutral, central QSLing point. There were also problems in coming to terms on the sharing of funding, equipment, and other details of the major operation. "It is hoped," Smith writes, "that with H.I.DX.A. standing to one side, matters can now be straightened out and the expedition made a success."

NO indication of what callsigns the four operators will be using, but a guess would be they'll use their own calls with the figure "8" in them (indicating Kermadec under New Zealand's new system), although that might be too logical. QSLs for 'BQD and 'AJW go to ZL1BQD, and QSLs for 'AMO and 'AAS go to ZL1AMO. ZLØAJW, who has been heard on the bands lately, is W6REC; QSL to him.

CHINA will reportedly be activated again by JA1BK, JA1MIN, and JA1EFT, just about the time you get this; look for BY4AA at Shanghai. And, according to Westlink Report, VE7BC's planned trip, commencing Mar 20, will include Chip Margelli, K7JA (ex-K7VPF), Chip's wife Janet, WA7WMB, and Fred Hammond, VE7HC. A press release from Margelli's employer, YAESU Electronics, notes that the Margellis are the first Americans invited to China for the express purpose of operating amateur radio. They will be working from BY1PK at Beijing and helping with training of operators. Note that this arrangement does not signal any sort of movement toward "reciprocal operating" arrangements between China and the U.S. Incidentally, K7JA is a world-class contest op.

OTHER TOP TWENTY NOTES: ZA2R operations last month were phony, according to 0H2BH, although some Finns were in Tirana at that time...

XUISS list operations continue on 14.334 or so at 1200Z, but there's a lot of help from the list masters (report relaying, etc)...

VU7WCY (second operation) QSLs hit many North American mailboxes last week, via California...

S.M.O.M. was on 160 Meters that night, for the first time...

OUR PREDICTIONS of upcoming DX Advisory Committee recommendations were right on target: they have now officially recommended separate, endorseable DXCC-type awards for RTTY, Satellite, SSTV, and 160, 80, and 40 Meters (by a vote of 13 to 2, one no-vote).

Main reaction to the "DXAC Papers" (TDXB exclusive in issue 228) was one giant yawn, most readers wondering why the Guidelines were so spooky. The DXAC has now recommended that the ARRL Awards Committee prepare a set of accreditation rules, and publish them in QST. Vote on this one was 15-to-1!

YASME: the Colvins left Easter Island Mar 17 for Santiago Chile, and anticipated departing almost immediately for Juan Fernandez. Look for W6QL/CEØZ to last several weeks, starting now. somewhere and dropped a letter this way for
