Martti Laine, OH2BH, had a scheduled trip to Albania postponed several weeks ago, after receiving a telegram from the authorities there saying they "were not ready" for him yet. The message was longer and friendlier than in the past, so there is still hope, Martti says.

Rumors of an Andamans Islands operation sometime this Fall continue, with the prevailing wisdom being that VU2GDG will lead it.

XU1SS Cambodia continues 20 Meter activity, but the signal simply does not make it East of about Ohio. Propagation on 20 will pick up in about six weeks, and there is a chance that 15 Meters will open on the XU/North America path in Oct.

BY1PK was heard in the States again Aug 8, in tandem with DU9RG (14.155 at 1100Z). DU9RG was about 20 dB over S9, and BY1PK was S9, working to the East Coast. They made another schedule for the same time Aug 11, and we will report on the success of that next issue.

From JA1UT comes announcement of another Chinese station, BY5RA opening from Foochow city, in the Fukien province, Aug 17. This is right on the coast of the South China Sea, only about 250 miles from Taiwan. When BY4AA was announced from Shanghai we had high hopes for better propagation than from BY1PK and BY8AA, but of course we've learned that propagation is not the limiting factor in working the BYs.

BY5RA is authorized 1.9-30 MHz, plus 144 and 432 MHz, CW, SSB, FM, and Satellite. Maybe RTTY, FAX, and 50 MHz later. JA1UT reports that the same JA group who got XU1SS on the air worked with the Foochow China Radio Sports Association to bring this new station to fruition. QSLs to Box 730, Foochow, CHINA.

NO TRUTH to rumors of a Mellish Reef operation in either August or September. There will be an operation later this year; the release date for the information is Aug 15, and we will carry the full story in Issue 251.

A STATION SIGNING JA8YDX/S21 was working Europeans on Aug 4 (14.188, 1900Z), but was just audible along the U.S. East Coast. No reports on him since then. Recall that the last attempt at a Bangladesh operation was about two years ago, by two Japanese who entered the country as part of a medical relief team but were unable to get their gear through Customs.

CRAIG MAXEY, WB7RFA, arrives in Sao Tome Oct 23 for a two-week stay, has applied for a license, and hopes to pick it up upon arrival. Says he plans to "work all bands, SSB." If the S9 license falls through he plans to try for an Angola D2 license.

Latest issue of VE3FRA's DX Report says "VY1CW reports Pradhan (A51PN) often in sked on 14.310 11-1200Z, worked Jul 9 at 1135." The last word we had from A51PN was that his radios were broken and he had not been on the air for almost three years.

WB6GFJ's F00FB Tahiti operations ended Aug 7; look for him the next couple of weeks from ZK1, 3D2, and VK/ZL.

STILL some confusion on the status of VK9NS's Pacific Island expedition; last word from Jim was that he would be on Papua-New Guinea working for a while, and he apparently left for P29 on July 28. He is still financially out of pocket from the 1983 Heard Island operation.

Status of recent Thailand activity in doubt: HSØJUA was reportedly a "special events" station by a number of Japanese (QSL JA1SDV), and HS4AMF was worked Jul 21. He said he's still not legitimately licensed but working on it.

The Clipperton team in California may have finally located a suitable boat, and they are working on re-scheduling last March's F08 operation for March, 1985.

**DXCC NEWS:** ARRL has now approved an endorsable 160 Meter DXCC, effective Nov 1 of this year, with contacts since Nov 15, 1945 counting. We expect to see a large contingent from the Boston area down here in Connecticut on Nov 1! There will be no Honor Roll on 160. ARRL is still studying an endorsable satellite award permitting Oscar 10 contacts.

ARRL's DX Advisory Committee is now voting on recommending an Honor Roll sticker for your basic DXCC certificate; no word yet on when the new Honor Roll plaques will be for sale.

**EDITORIAL:** Don't Forget the U.S. Phone Band expansion Sept 1 (TDXB #248). We predict that 75 Meters will become a pit of bickering in the 3750-3800 range; Extra Class licensees have generally been cooperative in avoiding ragchewing among themselves in the 3775-3800 DX window but the influx of Advanced licensees will exacerbate the problem, if only because of their greater numbers. The Extras will be pushed down toward 3750, an area frequented by VE ragchewers and nets. And did you notice that the only thing the Extras got out of the expansion was 5 more KHz on 15 Meters, the five KHz they started with in 1968 and later lost through a bureaucratic screw-up.

Finally, along related lines, time's running out to "upgrade" via an FCC-administered exam. You must schedule your exam with FCC for a date before Dec 31, 1984. When the volunteer exams take over next year, they stand to be more difficult than FCC exams have been the past few years.

DESECHEO operation Jul 23-25 was forced off the island when the Coast Guard advised a storm was on the way; they made about 7000 contacts, with a "handful" on 10 and none on 160. QSL both WP4ATF/KP5 and HI3RST/KP5 to WP4ATF; the group thanks the North Cal DX Foundation and Mosley Antennas for assistance with equipment.

NCDXF (and the Clipperton DX Club) are also helping with the upcoming Monaco operation of F6EYS and F6HIX, which is Aug 31 to Sep 8; they say operation will be 90 per cent CW, 20 KHz up from the bottom band edges.

ONE CORRECTION (so far) to the Survey in Issue 249: D2 Angola (#45) should have been shown with a movement of +17, up from #62 in 1983 (tnx KA1XN).

THE GROUP which joined WB6GFJ on Tahiti last month included K6KH, who worked 21 Oscar 10 contacts, W6GC (FOØILE), who used an RTTY rig loaned by N6IC, W6AM (FOØDCW), who "filled thirty seven ARRL logbook pages," and N6AXQ and W6MI. W6AM reports distractions included hula dancers, native shows, and topless poolside swimmers.

T00 LATE for publication was notification from ZS6BCR of his activity from Botswana Aug 3-5; he was joined by ZS6BUX, and they worked mostly CW. QSL to home calls.

3B8DA, Alex Mootoo, sends a note that he's 46 and works for the weather bureau of Mauritius. He has operated from St Brandon (3B7DA, 1970), Rodrigues (3B9DA, in 1975 and 1978), and Agalega (3B6DA, 1978). Alex says he's headed for Rodrigues again late this year or early next. He's looking for a "used" electronics communications course, if anyone can help.

LATEST FROM THE DXCC DESK is that nothing has come through in the way of documentation for current stations 5U7LD, 5X5GK, ET3PS. They are still looking at the papers on DJ5CQ/SV/A, and the prognosis is not good. As for G3LCS/A6, who is supposed to fire up this week for a three-month run, the chances of that one having official permission are only fair.
