• A number of up-coming operations have been announced in the past week, including:

OH8MA/8Q7 Maldives Aug 2-12, probably SSB only.

An Ohio group is working on a trip to the Galapagos, HC8 later this summer or early fall.

W3ESU and K8CFU will operate 160 only from St. Pierre FP8 Sept. 11-15, with a high-power set-up.

WB6GFJ continues from FO0FB Tahiti until Jul 30, then moves first to ZK1, then ZL and VK.

PJ8UQ and PJ8YL open from St. Maarten Sep 1, with additional stops at French St. Martin and Anguilla possible.

DJ2BW/CT3 will activate Madeira Sep 1-15.

• Insiders say DXCC status for the Pribilof Islands now seems likely, following the DX Advisory Committee's 9-7 vote to recommend it to the ARRL Awards Committee. The effective date for submission of QSLs would probably be around the next Honor Roll time, in March 1986. On July 17 the Associated Press reported that resident Aleut Indians on St. George and St. Paul Islands began their annual seal hunt for food under an emergency subsistence order.

The "harvest" will last until Aug 5. The U.S. Senate is considering regulations which would allow them to hunt the seals for furs, too. Until this year, seal "harvesting" has been regulated by a treaty between the U.S., Japan, Canada, and the Soviet Union; the treaty bans open-sea hunting but requires a harvest of 22,000 seals on the Pribilofs, guaranteeing Japan and Canada 30 percent of the pelts. As you know, for years various animal rights groups have protested the method of killing the seals, which is to beat them over the head with a club.

• Jack Anderson's newsletter says that PDR Yemen (S. Yemen) is "trying to wriggle out from under the Soviet Union's economic thumb by encouraging contacts (and contracts) with Western businessmen. The British already have reciprocated by upping their representation in Aden to the ambassadorial level." But Anderson reports that CIA estimates of S. Yemeni imports and exports put it in the Third World category, at best, compared to other potential customers in the region. He also says "Aden's regime is rife with behind-the-scenes power struggles, any one of which could bring back the old chill."

• Rumors of any Albania operation are probably false...again. A letter just received from Martti Laine, OH2BH, made no mention of him visiting or attempting to operate from there. But it's always possible that this is his way of discouraging pirates from coming on.

• Westlink Report says the RSGB is about to publish a directory called "Amateur Radio Software." It will cover computers and their relationship to satellites, CW, RTTY, data, packet radio, antenna design, QTH locators, and more. We will have details on price and ordering later.

• ARRL has responded to FCC's proposal to allow U.S.-licensed amateurs in the "Caribbean Insular Areas" to operate phone in the 7075-7100 segment. It should be noted that KL7 and KH6 amateurs already have that privilege, due to their proximity to IARU Region 3. ARRL commented that although Caribbean amateurs' claim that they are adversely affected by AM broadcast stations above 7100 is true, it is also true for virtually all amateurs in North America.

However, the League noted that the number of amateurs in the Caribbean who would be affected is small, and that under current frequency allocations those amateurs are often precluded from participating in emergency net operations involving other Caribbean stations.

LETTERS CONCERNING "WHO'S WORKED THEM ALL?"

• "I was reading your item about which DXer has worked "them all." Don Wallace readily admitted not working Diu and that others had worked it. Inevitably, there will be no one who has worked them all. DXers are transient, DXCC countries are likewise, but the country list goes on forever...with additions and deletions, that is.

"However, I have my doubts if anyone can really ever claim that he worked all the possible DXCC countries. How about Wrangell Island? My recollection is that the DXCC Desk put it on the Countries List back in the 50s, left it there for a couple of years and then deleted it, noting that it had been reviewed and did not meet the criteria. Also, inasmuch as no one had ever worked it, it made no difference in the DXCC standings.

"Perhaps the solution would be that once a country is on the DXCC list it would count forever. Or, if deleted, it should be deleted entirely. But then again, as has been sometimes mentioned, the DXCC Countries List is a state of mind."

• Jan Perkins, author of the recent CQ magazine article about W6ODD's operations in the late 1940s, offers a few clarifications to the article:

W1FH did not himself claim to have worked them all. N6AW saw W1FH's QSLs and that, along with the DXCC Desk's acceptance of his cards up to 1966, led N6AW to the conclusion that W1FH had worked them all.

N6AW has the paperwork which W6AM was preparing to submit to the Guinness Book of Records; the application was for being on top of the Honor Roll with the most countries confirmed for more years than anyone else.

W1GKK reached "them all" by submitting, in 1980, a QSL from VU7AH/CR8, Diu. All previous Diu credits were for W6ODD/CR8 and W1GKK's VU7AH/CR8 QSL is apparently unique. W6ODD was not quoted as saying W1FH was his only New England QSO from Diu. N6AW made that statement after examining the W6ODD/CR8 log.

Finally, Jan, noting we were thinking of a certain W1 now living in the south who could very well have worked "them all," mentioned someone other than the DXer we were thinking of! That makes two people who could have "them all," and we think there must be more.

#### MORE ON CW DXCC SINCE 1975

● K3FN, who surveyed fellow members of the CW Honor Roll last year, read our rundown last week on one DXer's progression on CW. Jim has supplied a list of some of the countries which have been active on CW since Jan 1, 1975, but which are currently silent. These are Jim's recollections and are not guaranteed 100%!

VU7AN/Andamans was apparently on briefly in very early 1975.

XV5AC was available until shortly before the fall of Saigon in May, 1975.

K5CO/5A was the last operation from Libya, in Sept 1977.

4W9GR was possibly the last operation from N. Yemen, in Feb 1976.

Numerous 5U7 stations were on in the first couple of years of CW DXCC ('75 and '76).

C9MEY was active in 1976, perhaps others as well.

SMOAGD/S2 was worked in Sept 1977. A few people were able to coax a CW contact out of S2BTF during his operations in 1979 and early 1980 (his later operation was undocumented and did not count).

SMOAGD/XW8 made a few contacts in the "early 80's."

Both VP8SU and VP8AEN were on from S. Georgia around 1980.

Finally, the 3Y1VC 1,000-QSO operation in Jan 1979 was mostly on CW (and very difficult to work - ed).
