### CLARIFICATIONS TO ARRL BOARD MEETING REPORT

The motion to add the Pribilof Islands to the DXCC Countries List was made by Pacific Division director Stevens, W6ZM, and seconded by Northwest Division director Mary Lewis, W7QGP. After the Board voted to table the matter, directors Stevens and Lewis asked to be recorded as opposing the motion to table. (See editorials by NL7G and  $\overline{\text{TDXB}}$  on page 2).

The DX Advisory Committee (not the Board) voted 15-1 to amend DXCC Rule 5B as indicated in Issue 297; the recommendation was part of their report to the board. The recommendation will be taken up by the ARRL Awards Committee at Headquarters.

Concerning 24 MHz, the Board adopted the following recommended band plan: 24.890-24-920, CW only; 24.920-24.930, CW and digital communications only; 24.930-24.990, CW, phone and SSTV. Although advisory commitees have recommended it, the Board has not yet authorized awards credit for contacts on any of the three new bands. A motion to study the extension of Field Day operations to the 24 MHz band was tabled, then withdrawn (ARRL Letter).

### THE PRIBILOFS

(Note: this editorial was written just before the ARRL Board was presented with the DXAC vote on the Pribilofs; NL7G was obviously unaware that the Board would have an opportunity to become involved in the matter).

"The DX Advisory Committee has voted (9-7)on the Pribilof issue, and we have WON! Not a decisive vote, but a win never the less.

"The next step in the process is the vote by the Awards Committee. This step in getting through the DXAC is 'merely' a recommendation process. To win the DXAC vote, although critical, only means that the DXAC will recommend to the Awards Committee that the Pribilofs be added to the (DXCC) list. The Awards Committee consists of WlGNC, W9KDR, WlSE, K8CH, W3AZD (non-voting@, WlXX, WlOD, and AA2Z. KlXA and NlCIX are alternates.

"I would be leading you down a winding road if I told you that I thought this vote would be a shoo-in. W3AZD, who is the DXCC administrator, has been very vocal on the fact that the Pribilofs would never count. He is responsible at this point to present the Pribilof issue to the Awards Committee.

"WIXX is Communications Manager, and chairman of the Awards Committee. He was solicited by the DXAC after the tie vote to respond to our examples of past determinations of point 2(a). WIXX's repot (to put it nicely) was not impartial, as suggested; it concluded with the statement that the Pribilofs do not qualify.

"Our reply to WIXX's report, although accurate, was undoubtedly not very well received by him or the others involved in writing the staff report. Just by this, you can see we have two members of the Awards Committee who may use their influence to bias the rest of the Committee. I use the word 'may' because at this point it would be unfair to say they won't be impartial.

"Where's the beef? Why was the DXAC vote so close? The first question is easily answered. The headquarters does not like being told they are wrong, and for them to admit so does very little for egos. As for the second question, I learned on my recent trips to Fresno and Dayton, some DXAC members said they would notvote for the Pribilofs, not because we were incorrect in our conclusions, but rather that it was never the

intended interpretation of that was written in QST (DXCC Rule 2(a) -ed). Therefore, whoever wrote the point (2) rule as lastly defined did not understand the intended interpretation. I have no idea who wrote the criteria that has appeared in QST for over 20 years, but I doubt they would appreciate being called dumb!

"The yes votes of DXAC members reflect the opinion 'that is what the rules say,' while the no votes reflect the opinion 'the rule was written incorrectly for what it is supposed to mean.' Really some heavy moose droppings, HUH?"

### WHY THE ARRL BOARD WAS RIGHT

The ARRL Board of Directors made a wise and correct decision in tabling a motion to add the Pribilof Islands to the DXCC Country List.

The motion, made by Pacific Division director W6ZM, was cooked up by him and DXAC chairman K6SSJ. By taking the matter straight to the Board and by-passing the Awards Committee, these two were trying to further erode the authority and responsibility of the Headquarters staff.

The Pribilof matter should never have got to the Board at this stage in the DXCC process. Had the Awards Committee voted against country status, the Communications Manager could have overridden their decision. Barring that, those pushing for DXCC status could then take their case to the Board.

Dozens of papers and studies have been written on this matter...the Awards Committee, as Headquarters staff members, are being paid for spending the time necessary to read the arguments before making a decision. It is difficult to see where any of them have any conflict of interest. And there are certainly more Honor Roll members and active on-the-air hams on the Awards Committee than on the board of directors.

The ARRL decision-making process is structured for efficiency...volunteer advisory committees provide member input, the Awards Committee provides guidance to the Communications Manager, who decides the issue. And remember that the General Manager can ultimately override them all; it is not unimportant to remember that the

current general manager is on the DXCC Honor Roll. The Board is a "court of last resort."

We would like to know why directors unnecessarily take matters such as this to the Board meeting, when problems such as the decline in the number of licensed amateurs and League members cry out for solutions.
