NEW 20 METER BEACON ANNOUNCED

LU4AA began operating Sept. 3 as part of the Northern Califoria DX Foundation's 14.100 MHz CW beacon net. LU4AA will key for one minute every 10 minutes in the 0008 time slot, following ZS6DN/B.

LU4AA is the first South American beacon to become operational in the net. A beacon with the call HK4LR/B has been shipped by NCDXF to Liga Colombiana de Radioaficionados for installation in Medellin. It will key in the 0009 time slot following LU4AA. HL4LR/B is expected to be on the air soon.

Stations now on the "net" are (in order of keying) 4UlUN/B, W6WX/B, KH6O/B, JA2IGY/B, 4X6TU/B, OH2B, CT3B, ZS6DN/B, and LU4AA. Each beacon station transmits the same one-minute CW message, consisting of four 9-second dashes at power levels decreasing from 100 watts to 0.1 watt.

- Guido, PAOGMM, has announced he will operate from Grand Comoro Island, as D68DX, Sept 17-24 and again Oct l and 2. He was unable to take equipment with him so he will be on the air if he can find a cooperative local. He'll sign FH/PAOGMM from Mayotte Sept 26 to Oct 1, and from both islands he will concentrate on 20 Meters. QSL to his home address.
- N7DF/TT8 is currently active only on 20 and 40, but says he is moving to a new location on Sept 24, where he plans antennas for both 80 and 160.
- ZLIAMO reportedly will operate from 5WlCW Western Samoa around October 12, then go to the Tokelaus (ZK3) for about a month. He will be on 160 if he can obtain an antenna in time to take with him.
- \bullet Some Europeans worked a "6WlHB/70" recently; the $\frac{DX}{News\ Sheet}$ reports that 6WlHB is Belgian, he has a $\frac{PO}{PO}$ Box in Senegal, and that at least one person received a letter from him postmarked in South Yemen. But he is now reported to be in Senegal.

- Holland's <u>DX Press</u> notes that this time of year is "Albania season," apparently autumn being the favorite time for tourist groups to go there. This also seems to be the time of year when ZA-pirates appear on the bands in the greatest numbers. It seems that the person with the best chance of operating from Albania is OH2BH, and nothing is happening with him.
- DXPO Atlanta the last weekend of September will feature ON4UN, W6OAT (FOOXX operator) and Carl and Martha Henson (3ClBC, 3ClYL).
- We are about to close out the <u>TDXB</u> Sticker Bank...only one input of transparent stickers has been received in the last year or so. We still have requests for the following: 335, 330, 325, 320, 315, 310, 300, 290, and 270. If you have any of these and are willing to part with them, please send them NOW. Otherwise, we are going to abandon the project.
- More hams in space...an October Spacelab crew will include two German hams, DG2KM and DD6CF. According to the ARRL Letter, they will ride the Shuttle, which will put the Spacelab into orbit, and they plan to operate from both the Shuttle and the Spacelab, on VHF. Detailed information is in all three general-interest newsletters, including the W5YI Report and Westlink Report.

Five years ago in The DX Bulletin

(September 15, 1980): ZLIAMO and ZLIAZV were operating from Tonga and Niue and planned to stop on their way home on Western Samoa. A German group came on from the Comoros and followed that with a Juan de Nova operation, signing FRODZ, CIW, and RX. AA6AA and N6ZV signed D68XX and GA from the Comoros, after brief 3B8 and 3B9 operations, and followed that with a Tromelin operation, signing FROFLO and FR7BP/T. UAlPAL was the only Franz Josef Land operator and was slated to leave soon. We reported that 10 Meters had opened its season with the first WI-JA opening on Aug 29!

Your editor was collecting parts (from a bunch of old CB antennas) for a 7-element 10 Meter beam. In light of the "big guns and little pistols," we decided our new beam should be called the ICBM.

I2XKF, DL1PM, and DL1RK went to the Vatican and operated round-the-clock CW, signing HV1CN. LU3ZY was workable from S. Sandwich...best spots were 10 Meter CW and 20 SSB, with lists. K3ZO was leaving Thailand, and HS1ABD, for reassignment. CE9AF was active from the S. Shetlands, 3B6CD popped up occasionally from Agalega, and VK9ZG was scarce but workable from Willis.

We mentioned that the People's Republic of China was reported making some halting steps toward private enterprise, and said "the crack in the door gets wider." China was #1 in our first Countries-Needed Survey.

Comment

Should advisory committee votes be made public?

In Issue 299, <u>TDXB</u> published the ARRL official ballot of the DX Advisory Committee on DXCC entity status for the Pribilof Islands; we had obtained the vote (9-7) even before Headquarters had. The ballot itself allowed DXers to see, for the first time, how each committee member had voted on a DXCC matter.

According to the ARRL Board directives under which advisory committees were established, the committees are allowed to set their own groundrules; one example is the making public of votes. The DX Advisory Committee could, if it wished, decide to make votes available to the press. The current DXAC chairman, K6SSJ, is opposed to this, believing that individual committee members could come under fire for their votes on various matters.

It was chairman Thompson, you will recall, who got Pacific Division Director Stevens to take the Pribilof

matter directly to the Board, by-passing the ARRL Awards Committee at headquarters.

Incidentally, there has been back-room discussion among Board members of opening at least some parts of their meetings to the press, by invitation. This does not appear to be likely to happen anytime soon, but the subject has been broached.

We think the DX Advisory Committee could better serve DXers by operating more openly...by providing input to the press about what the Committee currently has under consideration. This would enable interested DXers to respond to the Committee before votes are taken.

Further, we believe the votes of the Committee should be made public. If the DXAC does not choose to adopt this position, the Board of Directors could order them to do so.
