• DLOMAR/9G stands for "Medical Assistance Radio," according to the latest issue of Germany's CQ DL magazine. The cover of that issue pictures Baldur, DJ6SI, Jerry, 5X5GK, and others. Baldur was very active on CW there the last week of September as was DJ5CQ on SSB. There are rumors that other licensed Ghana stations will be on the air soon. It is believed that 9G2ER is not licensed. QSL DLOMAR/9G to DJ6SI.

DA2ER notes that DL0 callsigns are assigned to clubs but that DLOMAR is not in his 1985 Callbook. But, he says, it seems the 2X2 callsigns are used up, so DLOMAR would be a logical brand-new issue. The question is why would DJ6SI use a club callsign instead of his own?

• DK9KD sent late word that DK9KX, DF3KX, and DJ9ON would be in Sao Tome, S9, Oct 8 to 22, on both CW and SSB.

• Rumors at Atlanta's DXPO last week were that at least two Americans hope to operate from Bhutan sometime this year or early next. YAESU is involved, as is one of their American representatives. Since A51PN disappeared from the air several years ago, letters from him have said, at various times, that 1) amateur radio had been abolished there and 2) he was off the air for lack of a rig. A51PN's boss, who had a callsign but was almost never on the air, changed jobs about a year ago, moving from the PTT to another government position.

• W8TN's Clipperton slide show is reportedly entertaining; your editor will see it Oct. 12 at the New England DXCC Banquet. W6OAT fielded questions at DXPO regarding the limited number of F00 contacts with Europe...he said that others on the team wanted to operate RTTY during the 20 Meter openings to Europe. There was reportedly no explanation for the failure to work very many Europeans during the 40 Meter openings.

• K4UEE and others will activate four Caribbean Islands on 160 Meters later this month: St. Kitts V47 Oct 20; St. Lucia J6 Oct 21,22; St. Vincent J87 Oct 23, 24; St. Vincent again Oct 28; and Grenada J3 on all bands during the CQ WW Phone Contest Oct 29 and 30.

• Jim Smith, P29JS, returned to Papua New Guinea after a 10-day visit to Norfolk last month. He notes that his old VK9NS location (from which VK9NL operates) is a lot quieter than the P29JS QTH. P29PNG is apparently being signed from various places on the island, in honor of the 10th year of Papua New Guinea independence.

• The W9DXCC banquet "DX Hog of the Year" was Dick McKercher, W0MLY.

• J5WAD (UB5WAD) came on the air exactly one year ago, and said at that time that he'd be in Guinea Bissau for one year, so time may be running out. He sometimes shows on 7072 SSB 0200-0300Z, and takes callers from the U.S. on CW. He does seem to transmit a lot better than he receives on 40 Meters.

• PA0GAM at 9Q5MA has been doing a terrific job on CW, at least for stations East of the Mississippi. Let us know how workable he was from the Western reaches.


• A letter from Shanghai to the Western Washington DX Club says that the two Drake TR7s which were donated four years ago are in use at BY1SK, Beijing, and at BY4AOM, a new club station for "old timers" at the Shanghai Institute of Electronics.

• Editorially speaking: it's interesting to observe how other areas of the country see ARRL's Awards Committee vote on the Pribilofs. QRZ DX (Texas) headlined their report "ARRL 7 -- Pribilofs 0."

The Western Washington DX Club's newsletter, under a headline of "League Sinks Pribilofs" said "...the ARRL Awards Committee, in the spirit of the annual seal hunt, clubbed to death any hopes for the Pribilof Islands as a DXCC country. The humiliating vote was 7 to 0, proving once again that no matter where a DXer lives, it's better to be on the East Coast."

• 9M8GH, worked recently in Europe, is ex-T2CSH, using a barefoot rig and 20 Meter dipole. He will be there for a year and a bigger set-up is in the works. 9M8 East Malaysia has always been one of the most difficult countries to work from the Eastern U.S.

• We have received a flyer on Kirsti Jenkins-Smith's book, "Heard Island Odyssey." We expect to have a copy for review shortly. If you can't wait, \$14.45 U.S. will get you a copy by airmail, from HIDI-Y, c/o Post Office Box 90, Norfolk Island Australia 2899. Both Jim and Kirsti Smith plan to attend next year's Dayton Hamvention and International DX Convention in Visalia, Calif.



• DA2ER went to the recent meeting of the Clipperton DX Club (their 7th annual get-together). Bob reports a business meeting was followed by a typical French banquet, attended by PA3BFM (ZK1XC), PA3DHM (ZK1XD), ON5NT (recent operator at 9U5JB), F9LX (of last spring's Clipperton expedition), DJ9ZB, and others. The next meeting may be held in Strasbourg France (instead of Paris) so more of the central European DXers can attend.

• November QST will carry a very important article on PRB-1, the FCC's "antenna statement." The ARRL LETTER Sept. 30 issue was devoted to it...FCC has, in essence, come down in favor of hams, supporting the idea of federal preemption of local antenna zoning laws. The matter is far from settled, however. It does appear that anyone taking an antenna restriction case to court now stands a much better chance of getting the restriction overturned.

• The "160 Meter Information Net" is being activated again; 4X4NJ is prime mover, and he will be trying to have the group meet on 14.337 +/- at 1400Z Saturdays. This is purely an information net regarding 160 Meters. 4X4NJ is control because he has propagation to Europe, North America and the Caribbean simultaneously at that time.
