Wayne Green has returned to 73 Magazine, which he founded 25 years ago, with his first editorial in the March issue. Little has changed. Wayne wants more new hams, and wants all-of us to try something new in amateur radio. He would like the U.S. to have as many amateurs, percentage-wise, as Japan.

As for bringing newcomers into the hobby ... Wayne's right that kids just aren't much interested anymore. The average age of U.S. licensed hams is about 50, and rising.

Some of us do radio out of nostalgia, not out of getting any particular thrill from it. Ham radio used to mean doing something at home you couldn't do anywhere else.

At the newspaper where I work, we get news stories and photos via satellite, straight into a computer. The copy is edited and laid out at a computer terminal, then typeset by the computer. Manual labor has practically been eliminated.

It is a marvelous system for writers and editors, but a lousy time for craftsmen such as linotype operators and paste-up artists. Their jobs have been eliminated.

In amateur radio, most of us have long since given up any sort of construction and trouble-shooting, except for antennas. Playing radio is now a matter of buying the right boxes and hooking them up to do what you want. After that, the focus of the hobby is on finding somebody you want to talk to on the radio.

The biggest thrill still is talking to people far away, in other countries, and it always will be. That's why the ham magazines devote a lot of page space to DX and contests, and why people subscribe to DX newsletters.

Hams who chase countries, and VHF distance records, and try to better their personal contest records, are at least doing something.

Writing about the ARRL Bicentennial Celebration in July, 1976, I said in QST that "it is worthy of note that what we did (as amateurs to recognize the Bicentennial) was to operate on the air; no Bicentennial repeater forum, no 200th birthday repeater—in—the—sky, no national moment of silence for dead and departed DXers. We celebrated by holding a contest, a 48—hour activity doing what we do best: communicating."

Some facets of amateur radio, and many radio amateurs, come and go. But DXing is amateur radio. And don't let anyone tell you differently.

THIS IS THE LAST ISSUE of <u>TDXB</u> that I will write. I have spent a lot of time the past couple of years thinking about what I would say about the newsletter in my last issue, but now that the time has come there just isn't much to say...

Except -- thanks to those people who have given their support over almost seven years. You know who you are. If I tried to list all of you, I would undoubtedly leave people out.

One person, however, stands out, and that is Don Busick, K5AAD, owner of Madison Electronics in Houston. He was the one who encouraged me to start TDXB when the West Coast DX Bulletin stopped back in 1979. I don't think there ever would have been a TDXB without him. Thanks, Don.

Please give your support to the new editor/publisher. You'll be hearing from him next issue. The new address for $\overline{\text{TDXB}}$ is on page 3. There will be no interruption of $\overline{\text{service}}$.


