PROPAGATION: Apr. 29, Above Normal; Apr. 30, High Normal; May 1, High Normal; May 2, High/Low Normal; May 3,4, Low/Below Normal; May 5,6,7,8,9, Low Normal; May 10, High/Low Normal; May 11, Low Normal. TNX N4XX.

ALBANIA: Despite what you have read elsewhere, there will be no operation from Albania by DL7FT in the near future. One of our readers visited DL7FT in West Berlin in early March and was so informed. However, Frank will operate from Madeira Island as DL7FT/CT3 or CT3FT on May 15-25, 1980, using an Atlas 210X and a TH3 Jr. beam. Operation will be SSB only on:

14190 and 14197
21245 and 21295
28495 and 28545

with Frank listening up 5-20 KHz. QSL to Frank Turek, DL7FT, Peternienweg 99, 1 Berlin 47, West Germany.

CONGO REPUBLIC: TN8AJ continues active when he has electrical power. He works North America on Wednesdays, 21330 at 2130, from a list taken by either K6AXC or WD9GY at 2045. This operation is still not accepted by DXCC, but documentation was supposedly mailed on 18 April. Hold onto your TN8AJ cards until further notice.

BURMA: It seems that HS4AMI/VE3FXT visited Burma in mid-April to "check out" the licensing situation there. A number of Burmese nationals have licenses but are allowed to receive only. Considering that, it seems unlikely that an alien would be able to obtain transmitting permission, but it might still pay to watch and listen.

LUXEMBOURG: The Netherlands Noviomagum-DX Group is holding another expedition to Luxembourg, 15 May/1800 to 19 May/1200, on 80-10 Meters. No specific frequencies mentioned. They will operate both SSB and CW, using the callsigns PAØDUO, PAØINE, PAØKHS, PAØVVH, PA3ADJ, PA3AIR, WD6GET, and PA3ABA, all /LX, of course. QSLs to:

BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS: VP2VEZ by W5HF and VP2VEN by K5GOE will run 8-13 May; they will operate 15 KHz above the bottom of various U.S. subbands, CW and SSB, plus 7085, 14115, 14185, 21235 and 28485. Plus will "roam" 80 Meters. Both these operators are trying to complete DXCC with their VP2 callsigns. QSL to Callbook addresses of W5HF and K5GOE.

INDXF ASIAN EXPEDITION: 9M6MU appeared on schedule 20 April to be greeted by only fair band conditions. They were worked on the U.S. East Coast but were not loud on either 15 or 20 Meters. We had no problem here since they were on CW working split and whoever was operating had good ears! It is doubtful they could have been worked on SSB; we gave them 339 on both 15 and 20. The group was reported operating VS5KV shortly before the 20th, and a note from N200 indicated they intended to also operate from Brunei after the 9M6MU activity, i.e., until 3 May.

Dr. Don Miller, W9WNV, was found guilty on all counts in his murder trial; sentencing is set for 10 June, 1980.

Tim Chen, BV2B, who is on 1000-1500 Wednesdays, has TVI problems; thus, he does not call CQ, and keeps his transmissions short. He often works with KA6WW or W7PHO, among others, on 14215-235. Tim also works Saturdays 2300 to Sundays 0100 or so.

A51PN has been on frequently, 1130-1230, 14235, with help from AP5HQ.

A recent FCC memo says "Over forty percent of the amateur operators licensed by the Commission also hold Citizens Band licenses." 10-4

We have a report that W7PHO will handle QSLs for the just-completed K6LPL/KH3 operation. But Dave was saying on the air to QSL to N6AHU, so stand by a week until we can confirm.

5NØDOG (who is K4QX) works with the Nigerian Minister of Communications; he is spending a month back home in the States at present.

SSA (The Swedish national radio club) is up-dating its Swedish language awards book and KØDEQ is helping SM7WI collect information on US and Canadian awards, especially those which would be of interest to Swedish amateurs. Current award custodians are asked to send info to KØDEQ in the Callbook.

CRETE AND DODECANESE: Last minute info from Charles Jackson, SVØAA. He will operate SVØAA/9, Crete, April 30 to about May 6, thence to Rhodes for another week as SVØAA/5. All CW operation on 3503-07-13-17-26; 7003-07-13-17-26; 020-040 on 20/15/10. And Novices: 28115 and 21115. Jack advises that the bands available in Greece and its islands are 3500-3600, 7000-7100, and the same as elsewhere on 20/15/10. By gentlemen's agreements they use CW on the low ends of the bands and SSB on the upper ends. QSLs to:

ATTN LOW BANDERS: *The Japan Low Band Attackers Association is sponsoring the Low Band Century Certificate. Work different countries for points on 40, 80 and 160 Meters; count one point per country on 40, two points on 80, and five points on 160. You must work all six continents (but apparently not all six on each of the three bands). The basic award is for 100 points, with endorsement stickers at steps of fifty additional points. The certificates can also be endorsed for all one band and/or all one mode. Contacts after January 1, 1969 count. The fee is seven IRCs for the first 100 point award and two IRCs for each fifty endorsement sticker. It is not necessary to send QSLs, but rather a "GCR," which means a complete list including Callsign, date, time, frequency, mode, and RS(T) of each contact. The GCR list should be checked against your QSLs by two radio club officers, etc., and signed by them verifying they have seen your QSLs. Send the GCR list and fees to:*

GREENLAND: Jerry Harley, WA2TTI, will be in Sondrestrom Greenland again this year, signing WA2TTI/OX between May 10 and 16. Also again in June, exact dates not known. Last year Jerry made 1500 contacts during 10 days in May. QSL to his home address: 2127 Ferguson St., Schenectady, NY 12303 USA.

Jerry goes to Sondrestrom with the U.S. Air Force to fly ski-equipped C130 transport aircraft. They support the ice cap "dye sites" (part of the DEW Line) by taking in fuel oil. When time permits, WA2TTI/OX will use a TS180S, a TH3 Jr. and end-fed wire for 40/80.

DXCC NOTES: From the April issue of *Long Skip* (VE3FRA, editor):

SMØAGD/XW8 QSLs are now being accepted for DXCC credit. Eric has provided the proper documentation. A6XJA QSLs are being rejected, as no licenses have been issued in the United Arab Emirates since the government pulled all amateurs off the air on 11 February 1979. A6XJA has been heard on the air admitting he does not have an official license, but continues to operate anyway.

The DX Advisory Committee of ARRL will be recommending go/no-go for country status for Transkei (S8) and Bophuthatswana (H5) sometime this summer. They may also have something to say about Okino Torishima (7J1). The DXAC recommendations are subject to further consideration by the Headquarters paid staff.

PREFIX HUNTERS... VE3LSS, the Radio Club of the Listowel District School of Ontario, Canada announces that Communications Canada has authorized the first-ever use of the call prefix CI3 by their club station. CI3LSS will be on "all bands" 1-15 May, manned by VE3GCO, VE3HLL, VE3IZH, and VE3HYZ. Look for them 30 UP on CW and on 3780, 3810, 7080, 7210, 14190, 21245, 21290, 28490 and 28590. In addition to QSLs, they are offering a special award for working the station twice, on two different dates, or bands, or modes, or by two different CI3LSS operators.
