N6DX cancelled his stop at Niue, ZK2, and proceded to Tonga early; his original plan was to be at A35 until about September 27. His 5W1CF operation netted a number of contacts on 6 Meters.

The American official expected on the air from CHAD is Jim Bullington, N4HX. No word on when he expects to be operational.

Japanese licensing procedes apace: JL1 prefixes are exhausted and they have started on JM callsigns.

VE3FXT is stationed in Thailand and has been heard operating from HS4AMA; he expects to be there two years and awaits his own HS callsign.

HS1WR will be visiting the US following his participation in the WARC; he will in NYC October 8, followed by Orlando, Washington, DC, Fargo, ND, Las Vegas, and finally Los Angeles October 23-31. If you would like to coordinate a visit at your local club, etc., talk to Fred Laun, HS1ABD on the air.

The following information on the recent CHINA activity will appear in Japan's premier amateur radio magazine:

"...JA6HOZ created a lot of excitement around the world, although very short-lived, on July 15, when he got on the air from Kwangtung, China for almost one hour on 20 Meters. There were a lot of conflicting stories floating around, including one in HR Report stating that the pile-up was so tremendous that the Chinese officials put the station off the air, which was not true. To set the record straight, here is the true story of the events as told by JA6HOZ, Yuji Shimada.

"He works for a large chemical company in Japan, and has travelled to business trips to China previous-

ly, and has had visitors from China in Japan on occasion. He has for some time wanted to have the opportunity to operate from China, and finally, through his Chinese business associates arranged for a 'five minute' demonstration of ham radio from the Canton city hall, to be conducted only while local government officials were in attendance.

"He put up a 20 Meter dipole at the Canton city hall, set up his rig, and three high-ranking officials came to see the demonstration. He went on the air on July 15 on 14120 at 0607Z and closed down at 0702Z. As soon as he went on the air, a jammer came on the frequency, began whistling at first, and then proceded to play music. Yuji wanted to QSY of course, but he could not, as he was given permission to operate only on 14120 kHz. When the jammer briefly ceased operating now and then, he (Yuji) attempted to have a QSO, and succeeded in having a couple of JA QSOs. He managed to keep the attention of the city officials for almost a full hour.

"He did not receive written permission, as he desired, but only the oral permission from the local officials, and only for the single frequency, and only for the period that the officials were present.

"Yuji says we should not expect to hear him on from China again and, in his opinion, China is many, many years away from granting permission to its own citizens to operate ham radio, not to mention non-Chinese . . ."

Correction: In Issue #4 we should have said that the FCC will be closing their Laurel MD and Grand Island NE SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT FACILITIES, not monitoring stations. The goal is to have one of those facilities in each state, eventually.

The Australian group going to LORD HOWE island for the CQ WW Phone contest will be signing VK2ATZ/LH and will be on 160-6 Meters. They will work CW before the phone contest commences. QSLs will be handled by VK3OT. The operators will include VK3OT and VK2s, BYX, AOT, AAM, AKX, AGT, NDK, VFT and NUN.

We understand QSLing for the ZS6AF/T4 operation in the new Venda Republic will be handled by ZS4MG. His C/B address is S. Coosner, Box 325, Kroonstad 9500, OFS, Republic of South Africa.

In a June 11 memo, the chief of the International and Operations Division said the following to the chief of the FCC's Enforcement Division: "It has come to our attention that the monitoring network has been issuing notices of violation to US amateurs communicating with amateurs in Thailand. Monitoring Branch was advised by Treaty Branch that the Commission no longer has a 'ban list' (sic) of countries with which amateur communications are prohibited. The 'ban list' has not existed since at least April 5, 1978."

Now that we have all breathed a sigh of relief, word comes from HS1ABD that he will be monitoring 3517 kHz each day at 113OZ.

The DX Club of Puerto Rico has elected KP4AM President and Alex Mootoo, 3B8DA as their first honorary member. They have also approved a new award to be offered by the club, the All Caribbean Award for contacts with at least 25 DXCC countries in the Caribbean Sea area. Complete rules will be out soon.

From BOTSWANA, former A2CBX, now A22BX says the new A22 prefixes there became effective September 2. They were originally going to ride out the A2 callsigns through the end of 1979. A2CBW/A22BW has gone to Germany but will be back in Botswana in November.

It seems that VO6ONT is a special call to commemorate the 60th anniversay of the telephone in Newfoundland.

That TH8JM call was issued to the US Embassy in Bangui, Central African Republic, by the French government, when the C.A.R. was connected with France. The feelings of DXCC are that the French-issued license expired when they pulled out and TH8-JM does not count.

More bad news . . . that fine TL8AZ operation is unknown by the person designated QSL manager. Ditto ST2MR. Ditto 3Y1VC on 40.
