YASME Lloyd and Iris Colvin, W6KG and W6QL are now active /SV9 from Crete; they will probably be there for about a month total, through the end of October, and expect to hear them during the CQ Phone Contest next weekend. Their next stop is probably /SV5 Dodecanese, then Israel.

TURKEY: Our words on Turkey in Issue 58 turned out to be prophetic; TA1MB has advised his QSL manager, K2UO, that all Turkish hams are now off the air, and all incoming and outgoing mail is being checked. Therefore, DO NOT send anything to any TA station as it will place him in a potentially dangerous situation. Logs for TA1MB cannot now be sent out of the country to K2UO, so please be patient if you are awaiting a QSL from TA1MB.

LEICHTENSTEIN: DJ9ZB will open signing HBØBOE Oct. 24 and through the CQ Phone contest weekend, using a TS120S, external VFO (loaned by Kenwood) and a Wilson beam donated by W4GSM. Usual DXing frequencies and QSL to DJ9ZB, Franz Langer, Carl-Kistner Strabe 19, D-7800 Freiburg I. Br., West Germany.

MACQUARIE: VKØKH finished his tour of duty Oct. 15. VKØSJ has been heard, but is probably just part of a transition team and will not remain. The new team stationed on Macquarie will not have any licensed amateurs.

VP2KAQ from St. Kitts by NØTG and WØCZE racked up 4200 contacts in about ten days in September, including many, many Europeans and Japanese. On the return flight to Miami they ran into Dave Gardner, K6LPL, making his way home from FGØFIS/FS7.

On October 4, Herb Schoenbohm, KV4FZ, worked countries number 32-35 on 6 Meters, including Liberia, Dominican Republic, Japan and Curacao. Herb says he was beaming Southwest to work the JAs, and they were beaming toward South America...at the same time band conditions were not much good for North-South T/E to the States, but the JA stations appeared out of nowhere and lasted about ten minutes. Herb has now completed WAC on 160 through 6 Meters, plus both 2 Meters and 432 MHz via Oscar!

Enclosed with this issue is a CQ Worldwide Contest form, both log sheet and summary, suitable for reproduction. We know from experience, firsthand, that those who process the contest entries much prefer the official forms to homemade ones. This is especially important in the case of the CQ Contest, where the log processing is done entirely by volunteers. Thanks to the crew down at CQ for sending the forms so we could forward them to you.

Out of Africa, the following may be of interest: 9X5MH has been active recently on 21250 and 21300 anytime after 1800Z; Hans is a German but has been in Africa for over a decade...the Afirkaaner Net on 21355 at 1800Z or thereabouts is back in full swing and has hosted some choice countries lately, including Cyprus...K5LBU/STØ shows almost daily with DK2CC on 28750 at 1200Z...TJ1CK has been around 15 SSB at various times.

Transkei is not being counted as a country by DXCC, but interest in it continues to run high; their postmaster has announced a new system of allocating callsigns, with fully licensed amateurs using the S83 prefix, limited license amateurs using S84 only on 2 Meters and above.

Botswana now has an incoming QSL bureau: BARS QSL Bureau, Box 1873, Gaborone, Botswana. Botswana began holding their first examinations for a novice-type license in August. Although A22GTF was worked on the bands, the occasion it commemorated, the Gaborone Trade Fair, was cancelled due to the sudden death of Sir Seretse Kahma, the President of Botswana. On Sept. 20, a school science fair was held in the capital city and two ARRL films were shown: Ham's Wide World and Moving up to Amateur Radio. There is now a reciprocal licensing agreement between Botswana and the U.S.

UA1OSM and one of our readers in the state of Washington did a little mutual back-scratching, QSL-wise, and the result was two cards for Serge and a UA1PAL QSL direct. The following was related concerning the Box 88 system: "(We) can only mail our filled out cards through Moscow Box 88, all other ways being illegal. the Central Radio Club permits envelopes only, open, with no stamps. No private addresses or post boxes may be used on the envelopes. Any enclosures you send to Box 88 with your QSLs are confiscated: stamps, IRCs, any printed ham matter." This boils down to: Russian hams can send blank cards out direct, but filled-out cards only through Box 88 outgoing.-Ed.

If you paid a fee of \$20.00 or less for a license between Aug. 1, 1970 and Feb. 28, 1975 (to the FCC), you can get a refund by writing for form "Fee Refund Program Phase II," FCC, PO BOX 19209, Wash, DC 20036. You will be eligible if you got a new, renewal, or grade license, or a modification with renewal. This would NOT apply if you got a "2-letter" call sign under the old "Extra class with 25 years policy," which cost 25 bucks.

COCKEYED NOTIONS DEPARTMENT: How's your weather been? We have had guests here the past two weeks, who never seem to arrive at the right time to help with the Bulletin, but the point is extra people in the house tend to run our water well dry. It hasn't rained here in so long, we are 50 percent below normal in rainfall for the year. Technical tips from the TDXB desk: using an external receiver with a Kenwood transceiver (specifically the TS520 but TS820 is undoubtedly the same) is a simple matter. Connect the external receiver antenna input to the TS520 XVERTER IN jack. Connect the external receiver MUTE hot wire to the XVERTER JACK pin 8, which is normally grounded, open on XMIT.

JT1AN has been saying he will not be back on 20 Meters for some time, due to antenna problems. He has been putting a terrific signal into the States around 0000Z on 28575, as has BV2A on 28530 at the same time.

5N2ODOG will be on through the end of October, then back to the regular 5N0DOG call-sign. The occasion is the 20th anniversary of independence for the F. R. of Nigeria.

A4XIH and A4XIU sked their QSL manager, G4GIR, Sats. and Suns., 1300, 21150, and Wednesdays same frequency at 1900Z. Both these stations have been on the Afirkaaner Net.

Three queries this week about DJ7SB/TJ1 QSL cards, not showing from DL6KB; any word out there? We have not received our card for 600DX yet but expect it around the end of October. No reports of G3JKI/5A cards from F6CYL yet, either. 6T1YP cards have dribbled in from the June operation by OH2BH and OH2MM; that station has been on the bands again recently with local ST2FF operating.
