YEMEN

David Schoen, N2KK, completed operations in Djibouti as J2ØCN and left for Yemen Dec. 10. He will operate from 4W ten days if a license is obtained. As in previous operations, 80, 40 and 10 Meters will be emphasized...3505, 7005, 3795 and 28510. At this point his travels are running a couple of days behind schedule. Low band gray-line DXers check times for 40 and 80 in TDXB Issue 62. Dave will be in the ARRL 10 Meter Contest (last weekend) if he has a license.

GUINEA

Ian, VK4NIC has been active almost daily as follows: 28735, 15-16Z; 21202 or 21255, 2100Z; 21300, 2130Z. Ian's frequency has become a watering hole for many of the thirsty sickies with their carriers, catcalls, policing, etcetera.

9G1RT was expected to operate the ARRL 10-Meter Contest from Ian's station, and perhaps a day or two afterwards. K4YT expects to be there around the end of January, with a VFO to go with Ian's Yaesu rig.

KP2A and the International DX Foundation tried unsuccessfully this past week to gain entrance to Guinea for some operating from Ian's. Ian inform-

ed them that he can't even get a visa for his wife to visit at Christmas, so he is meeting her for the holidays in Dakkar, Senegal.

AUCKLAND/CAMPBELL ISLANDS

One report puts ZL3AFH on Auckland Is and another puts him on Campbell, but DXCC won't care. The 1980 Callbook does not list ZL3AFH so he is apparently a newcomer. ZL2ACP says he is on Campbell, has been there about a month, and is using wire antennas for all bands. He expects a stay of about a half year.

Another report has ZL3AFH/Auckland on 20 Meters CW at 0830Z.

SMOM: A NEW DXCC COUNTRY?

IAØKM continued active the week of Dec. 8 (TDXB, Issue 67). SMOM is a single building in Rome, claiming complete sovereignty and also purportedly the smallest country in the world. An application for DXCC status has already been mailed to the ARRL DXCC corner.

It is interesting to note that the Nationa Geographic Atlas does not show Abu Ail, but it does list SMOM.



SUDAN AMATEUR RADIO CLUB YOUTH & CHILDREN PALACE P.O. BOX 80 MORADA OMDURMAN – SUDAN



Last June, Marty, OH2BH, and Ville, OH2MM operated from East Africa as 6T1YP in the Sudan, ST2FF/STØ South Sudan, and later on the Aland Islands as OHØAM. The main purpose of the African operations was education and good will, and was sponsored by the Northern California DX Foundation. Background information may be found in TDXB Issues 34 and 42. QSLs for the operations have now been answered, via W6EUF for N. America, JAlIFB for Japan, and from Finland for the rest of the world.

Here is the final report by OH2BH:

"ST2FF/STØ:

JUBA is the center of the Automonous Southern Region of the Sudan. The area close to the Equator is different from the rest of the country, not only in terms of a more favorable climate and tropical nature, but also in regard to its people with a different color, race, religion and language.

"Ours was the first flight made in three months across the 400-mile desert along the Nile River. We stayed four days in the area previously isolated for cholera. People mostly paagued by chronic malaria were extremely friendly to foreigners who were assisting them in health care, education and other programs.

"9,000 QSOs were made from the Juba Hotel, where Nile fish was served for break-fast, lunch and dinner, due to a food shortage. The equipment functioned flawlessly on a shaky 160 VAC only supply. Only the Dentron relay circuit had to be rewired for our 12 VDC battery, which supplied our power during the hours of darkness.

"We are extremely grateful to Dr. Sid Ahmed Ibrahim, ST2SA, and Mr. Eduard Bashier of the Ministry of Information of the Southern Region for making this operation possible."

"6T1YP:

The Youth Palace is performing important tasks for the young people of the Sudan in many educational areas, including physics, chemistry, sport, music and the arts. The Physics department takes great pride in having trained Amateur Radio operators at their newly established club station 6TIYP. The Yugoslav (SRJ), German (DARC) and Finnish (SRAL) national societies as well as the Northern California DX Foundation deserve recognition for their contributions.

"As invited guests for training and lecturing, we managed to open the station 6TIYP for international friendship between the Sudan and the rest of the world. Some 10,000 QSOs were logged during four nights of operating. Mr. Amir Kobani (now 6UIAA), Director of the Palace, and Secretary General Fadul Kabbar, ST2FF, acted as our excellent hosts and many plans were developed for promoting amateur radio in the Sudan. We have reason to be proud of having the Youth Palace and their fine people in the ranks of amateur radio."

EDITOR'S NOTE: Starvation in Kampuchea, which came to international attention a year ago, has been stemmed somewhat by aid from other countries. Starvation in Africa has almost become a way of life for millions, and hundreds die every day from lack of food. The Sudan is especially hard hit due to a year-long drought.
