NAVASSA

NP 1AA was reported on Jul 2 but was not for real. Rumors abound that HH2JR and a group of about six Haitian operators will activate Navassa Jul 18-25. The problem here is that although Haiti has been claiming control of Navassa for many years, it was the U.S. which built the island's lighthouse and the Coast Guard still requires permission be granted for groups wishing to land on Navassa. It is believed that the Haitians will land without such permission and therefore DXCC would not credit any contacts they might make. Sources indicate that the Haitians are aware of the DXCC policy.

DXCC

Speaking of DXCC, nothing has happened on the K6LPL QSL card scheme yet, the status of early 60ØDX cards is still in limbo, and XZ5A is still up in the air so far as DXCC credit is concerned.

AA4M pointed out that the documentation for XZ5A (TDXB 97), which says "Time of Operation: 24 hours" might have been meant to be "24 hours per day" rather than a duration of only one day. Let's hope so!

One of the Burma photos which came in showed a "military radio station" with some unidentifiable homemade gear...very primitive. There is speculation that the Burmese appreciated the sophisticated Kenwood ham gear and saw some potential for its use other than contacting radio amateurs.

ZL1AMO showed up right on schedule from Lord Howe July 6, signing VK4ANS/LH. Ron works almost exclusively CW and will be on until Jul 13.

Although "official word" came from Costa Rica of a TI9 Cocos operation to be held July 10-17, TI9FAG and TI9VVR came on July 1 for several days. It is not known if the previously announced operation will be affected. A fairly permant station is now set up on the island and summertime short operations can take place at almost any time.

WBØICS/KH7 is with the Coast Guard on Kure Island and is primarily interested in running phone patches, but will work you if you're nice. He has thus far been reported only on 20 Meters SSB.

MAKE ONE FOR CHARLIE AND DI

England's Prince Charles (does he have a last name?) and Lady Diana will be getting married on Wednesday, July 29. In honor of the event, GB4RWD will be active Jul 28 to Aug 2, on SSB only 80-10 Meters. A special QSL card will be available to all who work the Royal Wedding Day station.

Also, special endorsements will be made to those working the station on the actual day of the ceremony. QSL to G4KIU, 10 Julien Place, Wellesborough, Ashford, Kent, England. A Royal Wedding Award is available if you work the station and send U.S. two dollars or ten IRCs. All proceeds to charity.

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Chuck Jackson, SVØAA, and Sid Bedford, W4MAT, should be activating the <u>Dode-canese</u> Islands about the time you get this and through Jul 28. Look for SVØAA/5 and W4MAT/SV5 80-10. Greek amateurs have full spectrum on 20-15-10 plus 3.5-3.6 CW on 80, 3.665-3.735 SSB, and 7.0-7.1 both modes on 40 Meters. QSL SVØAA to N200 and W4MAT to his C/B address.

Its not too early for East Coasters (and others) to be planning for the 1981 DXPO convention in September. In the past this gathering has been in the Washington DC area but this year the site is Atlanta, on Sept. 19 and 20. Speakers will include Jim Lawson, W2PV, Martha (WN4FVU) and Carl (WB4ZNH) Henson, and N2OO of the IDXF, plus Don Search, W3AZD, to answer your DXCC questions. The activity will be at the Ramada Inn, I-85 and Monroe Drive NE, and there's a special room rate available. Call now and mention the convention: 404-873-4661.

W6AM's annual get together is becoming a mini convention. 312 folks gazed at the Don Wallace Rhombic Farm the weekend of Jun 20 and consumed 500 doughnuts. Don even had a few neighbors show up and Tom Christian VR6TC passed his greetings to the crowd via radio. W6AM has trimmed his antenna farm in recent years, there now being only 61 telephone poles; ten of them are 140 feet high.

Speaking of which (Poles), Rich Assarabowski, KICC, will be attending a convention in Poland this summer, sponsored by club station SP9KHT. Rich is assembling a 35 mm slide collection of contest and DXing stations in North America to show at the convention; he will copy your slides and return them to you if you'd be so kind as to send him a few of your skywires and/or station. Rich leaves mid-August.

The Monaco operation just now getting in full swing is by a group of Dutch amateurs and they should be on 80-10 meters with their PA/3A calls. QSL all to PA3ARM. Scheduled to last until Jul 20.

Keizo Obuchi, JIIKIT, was in Washington recently on official business...he is

"congressman" and also president of the Japanese Diet Amateur Radio Club.
Obuchi met with his counterpart, Dave Siddall, K3ZJ, president of the Capitol Hill Amateur Radio Society, along with Sen. Barry Goldwater, K7UGA. Congressman Obuchi played a key role recently in getting Japan's radio laws modified to allow Japan to enter into reciprocal operating agreements with other nations. The revisions will take effect November 23 and such reciprocal agreements should start falling into place shortly after.

Further to the subject of Japan/USA Northeast 160 Meter QSOs (TDXB 90, 91, 93) K2GNC adds that there have been "many" JA/W4 contacts in past years. He agrees with W1BB that there is normally a "black-out" between Japan and the W1/W2/W3 areas. When Bill worked Japan on Feb. 2 the opening was only to South Japan; his three contacts were with JA6 stations. Bill met JA5DQH recently and they had a long chat on the subject...better antennas on both ends and the new KW power allowed in the States may lead to more QSOs in the future.

The TDXB editorial in Issue 94 concerning disposition of the bogus QSL cards (ref. K6LPL letter, etc) has brought almost unanimous agreement from readers. Newington's DXCC Desk is presently bogged down with the 600DX problem, XZ5A and XZ9A documentation, and the fake cards. Considering the fanancial and emotional drain on the League which the Don Miller W9WNV lawsuit caused over a decade ago, it is not surprising that ARRL is going slowly. The fact that Headquarters will have a change of top management next June when present General Manager Baldwin retires may be the cause of some footdragging, too.

Frank Smith, W8HMI, was unable to get in any operating during his just-completed African tour, except for brief appearances from Kenya and Liberia. While in Somalia he tried to get his old 601AU license reactivated but ran into a brick wall. (TNX DX Report).
